- 1. MEDCAPS were conducted each Saturday afternoon during the month of November; 48 women, 10 men and 235 children received assistance from the Medical Department. Two young ladies who are employed as waitresses in the MWSG-17 Clubs are voluntarily serving as nursing assistants and interpreters at the MEDCAPS. Their presence has served to reduce the apprehensions and increased the peoples confidence in the team.
 - 2. The CHAPCAP featured the following:
- a. 36 hours of English conversation instruction at the Danang Babtist Mission (BT 030777) 237 people attended these classes.
- b. 24 hours of English conversation instruction at the Danang Police Station (BT 034794) 92 adults attended.
- c. 24 hours of English conversation instruction at Duy Tan Hospital (BT 018767) 65 adults attended.
- d. 6 hours of English conversation instruction at the Catholic School (AT 993752) 298 children attended.
- e. At the USOM Hospital (BT 029782) 20 pounds of childrens clothing was given to pediatric ward, 10 gallons of DDT were donated and 9 man hours of cleaning and painting was accomplished.
- f. Movies were projected at the Duy Tan Hospital (BT 018767) twice during the month 143 patients attended.
- g. Scrap lumber for vocational training was delivered to the C&MA School (AT 993752).
