(U) 16 November 1967, A water pump was transferred to support MAG-36 in Quang Tri.

7. Data Processing. (U) Computer meter readings indicate a usage of 231 hours for the month of November. Two Marines and three Vietnamese were trained as Card Punch Machine Operators. They will operate the Electrical Accounting Machines (EAM's) located away from the DFI area. There are now eight machines decentralized and seven more are to be decentralized during the fiscal year.

Two young ladies who are employed as waitresses in the MWSG-17 Clubs are voluntarily serving as nursing assistants and interpreters at the MEDCAPS. Their presence has served to reduce the apprehensions and increased the peoples confidence in the team.

2. The CHAPCAP featured the following:

a. 36 hours of English conversation instruction at the Danang Baptist Mission (BT 030777) - 237 people attended these classes.

b. 24 hours of English conversation instruction at the Danang Police Station (BT 034794) - 92 adults attended.
