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PART TWO - Narrative Summary

3 June 1968 (U) The EOD team removed five (5) 105 H.E. duds from the hamlet of Lo Giang.

19 June 1968 (U) The EOD team removed four pounds of plastic explosive with a chemical delay pencil from the northeast corner of a political building downtown Danang.

26 June 1968 (U) The EOD team investigated the explosion which damaged an Air Force shuttle bus while crossing the I Corps Bridge. A pound and a half of explosive with a chemical delay pencil was the cause of 10 casualties and the demolished right front section of the bus.

28 June 1968 (U) The MWSC-17 Fire Department responded to a fire in the village of Hoa That. After a half hour the fire was extinguished leaving six houses destroyed and seven families homeless. A cooking fire was the cause.

29 June 1968 (U) The EOD team investigated an explosion in the home of Major HARDIDGE. One and a half pounds of C4 placed in a drawer of his table failed to detonate as the chemical delay pencil fell out of the C4 prior to activation. Damage minor.

30 June 1968 (U) The EOD team removed a Chi-Con grenade and one 250 pound bomb from the hamlet of Thon Con Dau where three children had been killed and six injured while playing with a dud mortar round.



Warehouse all 1-1, 1-2 and 1-3 locations have been completed in-so far as tactical markings being placed on boxes. Bulk items on pallets are now being positioned. Verification of stock and locations is being continued. A new UP&T was submitted to the S-4 Embarkation Officer prior to 1 July 1968.

M. T. Supply Unit:

Excess material from third echelon has been processed and turned in for stock. Fourth echelon has a continuing process of turning in excess to supply for screening and stocking.

Received a MSG, from SPCC mechanicsburg (131621Z June) advising us of the availability of LD427-2 Engines for installation in the M-35A1 Vehicles. A limited quantity of these have been placed on order to fill requirements for deadlined vehicles.

A reconciliation of items at FLC was accomplished on 10 June 1968. Differences between our records and theirs were corrected.

SRS Section:

The Supply Response Section made preparations for the migration of appropriated purchases account (APA) material to the Naval Stock Account (NSA) which will be effective 1 July. The entire Naval Supply System will be affected with approximately 550,000 items being changed over. The stock notice cards were delivered to the data processing installation for a machine listing. The stock record cards were annotated with new cognizance symbols and the unit prices were extended for total monetary value. The total monetary value of this change was reported to the Group Fiscal Officer for up dating the fiscal ledgers and for reporting to the Fleet Aviation Accounting Office Pacific. The stock control section cancelled requisitions that had been submitted to the supply system that were effected by this migration. The material sections were briefed on this change over and necessary steps were taken to cancel out old requirements for material no longer required. This change from APA to NSA effects the Group operating funds.
