PART TWO - Narrative Summary

- 1. Operations and events of MWSG-17 were of a routine nature during the month of December.
- 2. On 2 December 1969 the First Marine Aircraft Wing G-2 section held a ARM Inspection of NWSG-17 with satisfactory results.
- 3. British Naval Officers, Group Captain Michael J. R. SWINEY and British Air Attache Squadron Leader Stuart W. HOINES visited the In-Country Calibration Complex during the month of December.
- 4. The SOAP Lab analyzed a total of 72 special oil samples and the results were returned to the squadrons concerned, even though the lab was down during the month due to shortage of disc-electrodes.
- 5. During the month of December, Aircraft Staging received a total of 19 aircraft and transferred a total of 13 aircraft.
- 6. WERS\_17 Motor Transport Section with the help of other Groups, supported the First Marine Aircraft Wing Phase II re-deployment with (3) three Rough Rider Convoys. 
