PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Marine Wing Support Group 17 and subordinate units provided general support to the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing during the period 1-31 December 1972.

For CATEGORY THREE from 1-31 December 1972, the following support was provided for the organizations indicated.

Personnel. Marine Wing Support Group 17 provided 2 Officers and 39 Enlisted in support of Task Force Delta/MAG-15, 2 Officers and 39 Enlisted in support of MAG-12, and 1 Enlisted in support of MAG-36.

Operations. No aircraft support was provided during this reporting period to units involved in Viet Nam Operations.

Logistics. Wing Equipment and Repair Squadron 17 provided a total of 51 operational hours and 5 man-hours in support of MCAS and 1st MAW units including equipment operations and after hours such as dispatching and 2nd echelon maintenance connected with continuous operations. An additional 416 man-hours were expended to maintain TAFDS equipment which included 3rd and 4th echelon maintenance.
