### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of September this unit continued to provide support for the lstMAW as well as organic support of MWSG-17. The Motor Transport Section operated the assigned prime movers a total of 72,510 miles. A total of 3,170 tons of general cargo was transported during the month. There were a total of 1,501 taxi rums carrying 2,291 passengers for a total mileage of 9,878 miles.

The 4th Echelon Repair Facility received 563 items for repair and completed 598 of which 200 were beyond economical repair. At the close of the period there were 233 open job orders on hand. Of these 8.45% were in the process of completion, 21.15% awaiting man power and 70.40% awaiting parts.

The TAFDS Section continued the operation of two sites, Khe Sanh and the Danang Marine Air Freight Terminal. The Khe Sanh system issued 40,850 gallons of JP-4 and 31,059 gallons of Av/Gas. The system at the Marine Air Freight Terminal issued 1,134,191 gallons of JP-4 and 496,174 gallons of Av/Gas. Total fuel dispensed was 1,702,274 gallons.

The Engineering Equipment Section continued to provide maximum support within its capability. Electric power was furnished to the Air Terminal area, VMGR 152 area, the TAFDS site and the MWSG-17 contonment area. The generators now assigned operated a total of 3,175 hours. The heavy equipment assigned operated a total of 1,290 hours.

This squadron maintained a Cl status on personnel during the reporting period. There were a total of five (5) personnel joined on the rolls of this command during the month of September. There were a total of 18 personnel who went on R&R and 2 personnel who went on special leave.
