PART TWONARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of November this unit continued to provide support for the 1stMAW as well as organic support of MWSG-17. The Motor Transport Section operated the assigned prime movers a total of 73,703 miles. A total of 7,677 tons of general cargo was transported during the month. There were a total of 847 taxi runs carrying 3,625 passengers for a total mileage of 7,906 miles.

The 4th Echelon Repair Facility received 479 items for repair and completed 393 of which 160 were beyond economical repair. At the close of the period there were 119 open job orders on hand. Of these 9.77% were in the process of completion, 25.31% awaiting man power and 64.9% awaiting parts.

The TAFDS Section continued the operation of two sites, Khe Sanh and the Danang Marine Air Freight Terminal. The Khe Sanh system issued 26,019 gallons of JP-4 and 25,095 gallons of Av/Gas. The system at the Marine Air Freight Terminal issued 933,865 gallons of JP-4 and 68,859 gallons of Av/Gas. Total fuel dispensed was 1,053,838 gallons.

The Engineering Equipment Section continued to provide maximum support within its capability. Electric power was furnished to the Air Terminal area, VMGR 152 area, the TAFDS site and the MWSG-17 contonment area. The generators now assigned operated a total of 3,353 hours. The heavy equipment assigned operated a total of 2,842 hours.

This squadron maintained a C1 status on personnel during the reporting period. There were a total of 17 personnel joined on the rolls of this command during the month of November. There were a total of 40 personnel who went on R&R and 5 personnel who went on special leave.

TRAINING:

There were a total of 6 personnel who fam fired their T/O weapon during the reporting period.

AWARDS:

The Commanding Officer presented one Good Conduct Award during this period.

PROMOTIONS:

There were no promotions during the reporting period.

CIVIC ACTION:

Two personnel of this squadron assisted the Group Chaplain in teaching english classes to the Vietnamese at the Catholic school located in the village of Thon Phuoc Tuong for a period of three hours per week.

On 2 and 14Nov67 taxis were used to for the purpose of delivering civic action material to the USOM Hospital and the WEC Orphanage.

On 25 and 26Nov67 6X6's were used for the purpose of delivering civic action material to the CMA Mission.

On 1,3,6,8,10,13,15,17,20,22,24,27, and 29Nov67 taxis were used to transport personnel to and from the Baptist Mission, Danang Police Station, Catholic School and the RVN Hospital for the purpose of teaching conversational english and showing films to the Vietnamese people.
