NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of May this unit continued to provide support for the 1st MAW as well as organic support of MWSG-17
 - a. The Motor Transport Section operated the assigned prime movers a total of 61,687 miles. A total of 7,271 tons of general cargo was transported during the month. There were a total of 731 taxi runs carrying 2,497 passengers for a total of 5,122 miles.
 - b. Equipment received: One Lowbed and Potable Water Tanker (3000 gal) on temporary loan from NSA, Danang.
 - c. Provided five tractor trailers semis in support of 1st MarDiv.
 - d. Made general improvements in the Motor Transport Compound.
 - e. Prepared a Motor Transport SOP.
 - f. The Engineering Equipment Section continued to provide maximum support within its capability. Electric power was furnished to the Air Terminal area, VMGR 152 area and the TAFDS site. The generator now assigned operated 3,912 hours. The heavy equipment assigned operated 1,664 hours.
 - g. During the month of May 4th Echelon maintenance received 652 components for repair. We repaired 355 and 202 were beyond economical repair. At the end of the month we had 266 open job orders. Eighty percent are awaiting parts, ten percent are awaiting manpower and ten percent are in progress of repair.
 - h. The TAFDS Section continued the operation of two sites, Khe Sanh and the Danang Marine Air Freight Terminal. The system at the Danang Marine Air Freight Terminal issued 1,105,699 gallons of JP-4 and 25,550 gallons of Av/Gas. Total Fuel was 1,131,249 gallons.
 - i. The squadron was in a C-2 Status on personnel during the reporting period. During the month of May 18 personnel joined the squadron 16 were dropped from the squadron, 7 went on Special Leave and 21 went on R&R.
