4. Important Visitors: None

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1. During the month of August this unit continued to provide support for the 1st MAW as well as organic support of MWSG-17:

a. The Motor Transport Section operated the assigned prime movers a total of 60,116 miles. A total of 5,408 tons of general cargo was transported during the month. There were a total of 425 taxi runs carrying 1,469 passengers for a total of 2,148 miles.

b. Equipment received: Three (3) new M151A1 Jeeps and nine (9) new M149 water buffaloes.

c. No reportable accidents occurred during the period.

d. Received and transferred one (1) M37B1 Personnel Carrier.

e. The Engineering Equipment Section continued to provide maximum support within its capability. Electric power use was furnished to the Air Terminal area, VMGR-152 area and the TAFDS site. The generators now assigned operated 3,550 hours. The Heavy Equipment assigned operated 1,597 hours.

f. During the month of August, 4th Echelon received 229 components for repair. 297 were repaired and 176 were beyond economical repair. At the end of the month there were 280 open job orders. 80% are awaiting parts, and 20% are in progress of repair.

g. The TAFDS Section at Danang Marine Air Freight Terminal issued 1,366,501 gallons of JP-4 and 69,492 gallons of Av/Gas. Total fuel was 1,435,993 gallons.

h. The Squadron was in a C-2 status on personnel during the reporting period. During the month of August 30 personnel joined the Squadron, 28 were dropped from the Squadron, 5 went on special leave and 24 went on R&R.

2. Training

a. There were a total of 201 man hours of GMS training during the reporting period.

3. Promotions

a. There were 4 promotions during the period.
