

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. General (U) Marine Air Control Group Eighteen was activated on 1 September 1967 as directed by CMC message 071831Z/August 1968. During the period 1 30 September 1967, MACG-18 provided 1st Marine Aircraft Wing with support in air control and air defense.
- 2. <u>Personnel</u> (C) MASS\_2, MASS\_3, MACS\_4 and 2nd LAAM Bn all joined sufficient personnel to offset normal rotation losses and remain in a C\_1 category. 1st+LAAM Bn remained in a C\_2 category while H&HS\_18 is considered in a C\_4 category.
- 3. Administration (U) Routine administration progressed throughout the month of September.
- 4. Morale/Welfare (U) Liberty remained secured in DaNang and Hoa Phut Village, outside Danang Air Base, throughout the month of September. The beach facilities in the DaNang/Chu Lai areas were open to all hands and provided the majority of recreation for personnel. In country R&R was provided at China Beach and there were one day cultural sight-seeing tours to Hue and DaNang City, along with one day fishing trips every Wednesday and Saturday. R&R flights to the following locations were conducted during the month of September.

## 8. Training (U)

- (1) MACG-18 provided transport support for III MAF convoys (Rough Riders) for a total mileage of 4,204 and transported 286 short tons of cargo. The cargo/mileage for MACG-18 vehicles was 6,768 short tons of cargo transported and a total mileage driven of 94,250 miles.
