NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During November 1969, MAG-36 continued the redeployment of its two remaining squadrons: H&MS-36 and MABS-36. Personnel and equipment were moved overland to Tan My port without incident, and embarked aboard shipping for the voyage to Okinawa. Major General William G. THRASH, Commanding General 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, honored the departure of MAG-36, from four years of combat in Vietnam, with a Farewell Geremony on 4 November 1969. The ceremony reviewed the Group's impressive combat history and paid special tribute to its "Fallen Comrades" who gave the fullest measure of their devotion, to duty and the cause of freedom.

H&MS-36 officially stood down as of 1 November to prepare for sailing on 7 November. All support possible continued to MAG-16 (Forward) as they assumed responsibilities for Phu Bai Combat Base and combat operations of the three squadrons remaining; HML-367, HMM-161 and HMM-262. Finally, H&MS-36 embarked aboard 4 ships, and sailed for Naha, Okinawa. Heavy seas churned by a typhoon made the journey a rough one and the USS Sutter County was to be plagued still further by two fires enroute. Nevertheless, though delayed several days by the storm, all arrived safely. The final ship, the USS Pitkin County dropped anchor in Naha Harbor on 15 November.

Meanwhile MABS-36 was relieved of base support responsibilities by MAG-16 on 10 November in order to begin its move to Tan My. On 20 November MABS-36 relinquished defense of the Alpha Sector of the Phu Bai Combat Base perimeter to the CG, XXIV Corps. Initial elements of the squadron set sail on 2 November aboard the first of four ships. The final contingent completed its journey to MCAF Futema on 6 December. This date also marked the completion of MAG-36 redeployment from Phu Bai Combat Base, RVN to MCAF Futema, Okinawa. MAG-36 Headquarters had previously shifted the Command post by air on 15 November.

On 18 November MAG-36 assumed command of HMH-462, VMO-6 and H&MS-15 Sub-Unit #1; command less OPCON of HMM-164, HMM-165 and VMGR-152. OPCON of these squadrons was retained as follows: HMM-164 as aviation element of SLF B under CTB 79.5; HMM-165 as aviation element of SLF A under CTG 79.4; and VMGR-152 under CG lstMAW(R).

Many routine problems associated with relocating a Marine Aircraft Group from combat to a garrison status have been met and solved. Lack of troop billeting, hangar and office space continue to be significant problems. The opening of a new four story barracks in December will alleviate the billeting problem.

1. Significant Events for the Month of November

- 4 November 1969 MAG-36 Farewell ceremony was held this date with all squadrons at Phu Bai participating. Each type aircraft attached to MAG-36 was represented in a fly-over.
- 6 November 1969 The first of two detachments from H&MS-36 departed from Tan My RVN aboard the USS Park County (LST 1077) and USS Sutter County (LST 1150). Both ships arrived at Naha harbor on 15 November 1969.
- 7 November 1969 The USS Pitkin County (IST 1082) sailed with a detachment of HFMS-36 from Tan My and arrived at Naha harbor on 15 November 1969.
- 9 November 1969 The remaining detachment of H&MS-36 departed Tan My abourd the USS Union (AKA 106) and arrived at Naha, harbor on 14 November 1969.
- 10 November 1969 MARS-36 stood down and turned over responsibility of the base support to AAG-26 (Forward).
- 15 November 1969 MAG-36 Headquarters shifted command from Phu Bai Gombat Base to MCAF Futema.
- 18 Novembor 1969 CO, MAG-36 assumed command of the following units:
 HMH-462, VMO-6, AND H&MS-15 Sub-Unit #1. Command
 less OPCON was assumed of HMM-164, HMM-165 and
 VMGR-152.
- 19 November 1969 USS Union (AKA 106) departed Danang harbor with the first detachment of MASS-36 and arrived at Naha harbor on 25 November 1969.
- 20 November 1969 MARS-36 passed responsibility of Alpha Sector at Phu Bai Combat Base to CG, XXIV Corps.
- 21 November 1969 The USS Washoe Gounty (1917 1165) departed Danang with a detachment of MAIS-36 personnel and arrived at Naha harbor on 29 November 1969.
- 23 November 1969 General Lewis W. WALT, Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps, visited MAG-36 and was briefed by Brig Gen William G. JOHNSON. Gen WALT presented VMO-6 with the Commandant's Aviation Efficiency Award for Fiscal Year 1969.


b. Civic Action. Although the Civic Action Program was officially terminated in October some activity was continued. The MAG-36 Chaplain maintained contact with his Vietnamese counterparts. Visits were made and assistance given to the American Sisters in Huo, the Catholic School and Orphanages in Hue and Phu Luong. Chaplain Civic Action gifts for the period of 1-15 November consisted of one 6x6 load of scrap lumber to Father Joseph Phuoc, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Huo, RVN; 100 lbs of clothing to Father Joseph Phuoc and \$300.00 to Father Joseph Phuoc, to assist in his boys' boarding house.

c. Chaplain Services

- (1) During the month of November, the MaG-36 Chaplain conducted services for the Catholic personnel and the Protestant Chaplain from the 85th Evacuation Hospital provided for the services of the Protestant personnel. Divine Services were available for Latter Day Saints personnel at the 26th Support Group and for Jewish personnel at the XXIV Corps Chapel.
- (2) The Catholic Chaplain conducted Divine Services for the 101st Airborne Administration Section, Phu Bai and for NSAD, Tan My, each Sunday morning. The Catholic Chaplain also conducted Divine Services for the

outlying CAG units. Hospital visits were made to the MAG-36 personnel at the 85 th Evacuation Hospital.

- (3) A total of 34 services there conducted aboard MAG-36 compound and MGAF Futema with 590 personnel attending. Off base services at Tan My, 101st Airborne Administration Section and outlying CAG units were conducted with 90 personnel in attendance.
- (4) One memorial service was conducted at MAG-36 with an attendance of 12.
- (5) The MAG-36 Chaplain departed RVN on 15 November with his clerk for MCAF, Futema, Okinawa. MAG-16 (Forward) assumed occupancy of the MAG-36 Chapel with Chaplain Peter J. CARY, Lt, CHC, USER as the Group Chaplain. The Chapel at Phu Bai was left to MAG-16 (Forward). Complete Chapel needs were proveded by MAG-36 before redeployment. In addition to the supply of their needs, MAG-36 contributed \$1,000.00 to the establishment of a MAG-16 (Forward) Chapel Fund. The Protestant and Catholic Chapel Funds of MAG-36 each contributed \$500.00.
- (6) The MAG-36 Chaplain and his clerk arrived in Okinawa on 15 November 1969. The Chaplain was provided an office in the MCAF Station Chapel. All Divine Services are conducted in the MCAF Chapel. MCAF has one Chaplain aboard (Protestant, CDR. D. C. ALEXANDER, CHC, USN). Chaplain ALEXANDER provides coverage for Station and MAG-36 Protestant Personnel. The MAG-36 Chaplain provides services for Station and MAG Catholic personnel.

5. Communications

- a. During the period 1-10 November the message center handled approximately 3000 incoming and outgoing messages. Communications guard was via MAG-16 (Forward) during the period 11-15 November 1969.
- , b. All communication efforts for the month were aimed at embarkation readiness, mount-out and shipboard movement to Futema. Existing wire cable-system and fixed plant facilities at Phu Bai were turned over to MAG-16 (Forward) on 15 November 1969.
 - c. The Communications Section was aboard ship 21-29 November 1969.
