NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- (C) Throughout most of the six month period HMM-164, attached to the 33rd MAU, remained embarked aboard the USS OKINAWA, with an average of 12 CH-46's, 6 CH-53's and 4 UH-1E's. On 9 December 1972, HMM-164 conducted a cross-deck movement to the USS INCHON, while in port at Subic Bay, Philippines. The report of their operational activities is contained in the chronological history of the 33rd MAU.
- (C) HMM-165, with an average of 12 CH-46's, 6 CH-53's and 4 UH-1E's, was embarked aboard the USS TRIPOLI until 3 August 1972, at which time the squadron transferred to the USS NEW ORLEANS, remaining embarked thereon in support of the 31st MAU. A report of 165's operational activities is contained in the chronological history of the 31st MAU.
- (C) HMA-369 commenced this semiannual period embarked aboard the USS DENVER, conducted a cross-deck movement to the USS CLEVELAND on 1 August 1972, and conducted a further cross-deck movement to the USS DUBUQUE on 6 December 1972. The squadron, with an average of 7 AH-1J's continued its interdiction role for MARHUK operations. A resume of HMA-369's operations will be found in the historical records of the 9th MAB.
- (U) During this reporting period, H&MS-36 completed a total of 248.8 flying hours, with a complement of one CH-46D. A total of 172.7 flight hours were flown in ferrying 11 aircraft to and from PAR for deployed squadrons. The squadron was called upon to complete a variety of missions, ranging from support of the 3rd Marine Division training program, to aiding the Okinawa Civic Action Program by the use of emergency medical evacuations. In addition to flying and pilot training, the squadron continued in its primary function of IMA and supply support for the tactical squadrons of Marine Aircraft Group 36.
- (C) H&MS-36, Detachment Delta, with an average of 4 CH-46's continued to provide SAR/Medevac, logistic and security support for Task Force Delta at Nam Phong, Thailand, as well as administrative/liaison support for MAG-15.

- (C) HMH-462, with mine CH-53's assigned, provided logistic support to MAG-36 during this reporting period, flying a total of 2033 sorties, involving 1085 tasks and lifting 10,172 passengers and 418.3 tons of cargo. Flight time for the period totaled 1058.9 hours including 70.3 hours flown in support of the United States Atomic Energy Commission, on Eniwetok Atoll in the Marshall Islands.
- (C) VMGR-152 remained primarily committed to operations in Southeast Asia during the period July through December. Support of Task Force Delta consisted of four KC-130F aircraft, dropping to three for a short period. At NAS Cubi Point, R. P., one aircraft was committed in support of VMCJ-1. This aircraft provided daily shuttle service for the VMCJ maintenance crew and aerial refueling to their EA-6A's when operational committments dictated. This unit also flew a variety of other missions including VIP support, one Transpac Operation and local training flights to upgrade pilot proficiency. The squadron flew 2,031.1 hours, carrying 12,940 passengers and 10,188,029 pounds of cargo and baggage. A summary of VMGR-152 Detachment Delta support aircraft operations may be found in the chronological history of Task Force Delta.
- (C) The remaining subordinate units of MAG-36 supported Vietnam operations through unit and individual training while providing replacement personnel for units under operational control of 31st and 33rd Marine Amphibious Units, Task Force Delta, and H&MS-36 at Atsugi, Japan. Flight hours for the Group exceeded 22,000 for this period.

- (C) Throughout the month of December 1972, HMM-164, attached to the 33rd Marine Amphibious Unit, remained embarked aboard the USS OKINAWA with twelve CH-46's, six CH-53's, and four UH-1E's. The report of their operational activities is contained in the monthly chronology of the 33rd MAU.
- (C) HMM-165, with twelve CH-46's, six CH+53's, and four UH-1E's remained embarked aboard the USS NEW ORLEANS, in support of the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit. A report of HMM-165's operational activities is contained in the monthly chronology of the 31st MAU.
- (C) Upon completion of cross-deck transfer from the USS CLEVELAND to the USS DUBUQUE, on 5 December 1972, HMA-369, with seven AH-1J's continued its interdiction role for MARHUK operations. 
