1. (C) Throughout the month of September 1972, HMM-164, attached to the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit, remained embarked aboard the USS Okinawa with fourteen CH-46's, six CH-53's and four UH-1E's. The report of their operational activities is obtainable in the Monthly Chronology of the 31st MAU.
2. (C) HMM-165, with thirteen CH-46's, six CH-53's and four UH-1E's, remained embarked aboard the USS New Orleans in support of the 33rd Marine Amphibious Unit. A complete report of HMM-165's operational activities will be documented in the Monthly Chronology of the 33rd MAU.
3. (C) Aboard the USS Cleveland, HMA-369, with seven AH-1J's, continued it's interdiction role for MARHUK operations. A resume of HMA-369's operations for the month of September will be found in the 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade Monthly Chronology and HMA-369 message 021520Z October 1972 (S).
4. (C) H&MS-36 Detachment Delta, with four CH-46's, continued to provide SAR/MEDEVAC, logistic, and security support for Detachment Delta at Nam Phong, Thailand. The Monthly Chronology of Task Force Delta will contain detailed information on the operational activities of H&MS-36 Detachment Delta.
5. (U) HMH-462, with six CH-53D aircraft, continued to carry the bulk of local MAG-36 operations. Their 240 hours was in support of MAG-36, the III Marine Amphibious Force, the 3rd Marine Division, the U.S. Army and the U.S. Air Force; as well as squadron training. A total of seven (7) emergency MEDEVACS were flown in addition to paradrops, trooplifts and administrative MARHELOG flights. See Tab-I for a detailed summary.
6. (U) MAG-36 Operations were halted from 14 - 16 September when Typhoon HELEN caused all Group units to activate Typhoon Control Watches. No damage was sustained.
7. (C) VMGR-152, augmented with two aircraft from VMGR-352, continued its intense support of SEA operations logging a total of 838.0 hours. 1,631 passengers and 591,606 pounds of cargo were transported, in addition 2,139,125 pounds of fuel was transferred to 265 aircraft during 91 tanker sorties. VMGR-152 also participated in operation KEY GROVE. A detailed summary of VMGR-152's activities is located in Tab-J.
8. (U) The remaining subordinate units supported Vietnam operations through unit and individual training which provided replacement personnel for units detached to the 31st and 33rd Marine Amphibious Units, detachments at Nam Phong, Thailand, and in Atsugi and Iwakuni, Japan.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. The First Marine Aircraft Wing continued pre-IG inspection of MAG-36 during the month of September. The Operations inspection resulted in an overall grade of Satisfactory for the Group S-3. Training scheduled Wing inspections for Human Affairs, Squadron Operations, Administration, Adjutant, and Legal sections.

2. Majors ROSS, MCRANEY, and COX and Captain BURNS served as 1st MAW representatives on an ad hoc committee convened by the CG, III MAF. This committee drafted standing operating procedures (SOP's) for:

- a. Activation of Marine Air/Ground Task Force (MAGTF) Headquarters.
- b. Command and Control of MAGTF.
- c. Embarkation of MAGTF's.

3. Typhoon HELEN threatened Okinawa and MAG-36 from 14 - 16 September and halted local flight operations. The Operations Section quickly implemented the Typhoon SOP and formed the nucleus of the Typhoon Control Center. Typhoon HELEN passed well to the north of Okinawa, and no damage occurred to any Group assets.

4. On 28 - 29 September, the Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps, General E. E. ANDERSON, visited Marine installations on Okinawa. The General was given expeditious transportation to his stringent itinerary by HML-367. On 29 September, the General was given a joint briefing/tour by the Commanding Officer of MCAS(H) Futema and the Commanding Officer of Marine Aircraft Group 36.



PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

After almost a month of carefully staffing means of providing IMRL support of five Cobras attached to VMQ-6, a feasible, practical plan has been agreed upon and is in operation. This plan involves using applicable IMRL items from H&MS-36 (Sub Unit 1) and requisitioning other required items using HMA-369's IMRL.

The five aircraft are presently being flown and no unsolvable problems are anticipated.

Furthermore, the support procedure being utilized will expedite transfer of these 5 AH-1J's along with their IMRL equipment to HMA-369.

A liaison between MAG-36 and 3rd FSR provided better supply support posture with 3rd FSR.

A new embarkation box building program was begun in September 1972. 3rd FSR, PP&P, can produce boxes on an assembly line basis and the cost per box will remain approximately the same. PP&P will handle each squadron separately, and should be able to rapidly bring the Group to 100% possession of required embarkation boxes.

The present contract for commercial forklifts was increased to include (3) additional forklifts to provide better logistic support for the squadrons.



NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 9 September MAJGEN John SINGLAUB, USA, Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Drug and Alcohol Programs visited major commands on Okinawa.
