NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. (C) Throughout the month of October 1972, HMM-164, attached to the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit, remained embarked aboard the USS Okinawa with fourteen CH-46's, six CH-53's and four UH-1E's. The report of their operational activities is obtainable in the monthly chronology of the 31st MAU.
2. (C) HMM-165, with thirteen CH-46's, six CH-53's and four UH-1E's, remained embarked aboard the USS New Orleans in support of the 33rd Marine Amphibious Unit. A report of HMM-165's operational activities will be contained in the monthly chronology of the 33rd MAU.
3. (C) Aboard the USS Cleveland, HMA-369, with seven AH-1J's, continued its interdiction role for MARHUK operations. A resume of HMA-369's operations for the month of October will be found in the 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade Monthly Chronology and HMA-369 message 040515Z Nov 72 (S).
4. (C) H&MS-36 Detachment Delta, with four CH-46's continued to provide SAR/Medevac, logistic and security support for Task Force Delta at Nam Phong, Thailand. The monthly chronology of Task Force Delta will contain detailed information on the operational activities of H&MS-36 Detachment Delta.
5. (U) HMH-462, with six CH-53D aircraft, provided the majority of local MAG-36 logistical support. The 170 hours were flown in support of the III Marine Amphibious Force, the 3rd Marine Division, MAG-36, the U.S. Air Force and additionally as squadron training. The major portion of operational assets were employed in support of the night RAIDEX Training of BLT 3/9. The squadron also deployed two CH-53D's with crews and support personnel in support of the Atomic Energy Commission's Radiation Tests on Eniwetok Island. (See Tab G for a detailed summary).

6. (C) VMGR-152, augmented with two aircraft from VMGR-352, in continuing its intense support of SEA operations, accumulated a total of 399.3 flight hours. At NAS Cubi Point, Republic of the Philippines, one KC-130F continued to provide daily support for the VMCJ-1 Electronic Warfare Operations. A detailed summary of VMGR-152's activities is located in Tab I, exclusive of VMGR-152 Det Delta's operational activities which can be found in the monthly chronology of Task Force Delta.

7. (U) The remaining subordinate units supported Vietnam operations through unit and individual training while providing replacement personnel for units under operational control of 31st and 33rd Marine Amphibious Units, Task Force Delta, MCAS Iwakuni, Japan and H&MS-36 at Atsugi, Japan.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

The first week in October found the S-2 Section of MAG-36 moving into a new office and the unexpected TAD orders of Lt. L. O. PFAUTZ to Human Relations School in Hawaii with the Assistant S-2, CWO-2 FINCHER, taking over as S-2 Officer.

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

In order to provide proper supervision of the MAG-36 Transient Facility, control was transferred from Group S-4 to H&MS-36.

During the month of October, HMM-164, HMM-165 and HMA-369 arrived at Okinawa and were furnished logistic support as required by MAG-36, (e.g. Billeting, Transportation and Maintenance Support). All MABST/E accountable equipment was replaced for each squadron. HMA-369 was debarked from the USS Cleveland, operated ashore during the period 12 through 24 October and re-embarked on 25 October 1972.

A minor construction review board meeting was held on 25 October 1972. MAG-36 minor construction projects were assigned a priority within the Camp Butler Maintenance Funding schedule.

Water rationing went into effect at 2100, 24 October 1972. Water is cut-off from 2300-0500 daily, all available purification and storage support equipment has been put into use to provide potable water throughout the base.
