NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- (C) Throughout the month of November 1972, HMM-164, attached to the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit, remained embarked aboard the USS OKINAWA with fourteen CH-46's, six CH-53's, and four UH-1E's. The report of their operational activities is contained in the monthly chronology of the 31st MAU.
- (C) HMM-165, with thirteen CH-46's, six CH-53's, and four UH-1E's remained embarked aboard the USS NEW ORLEANS, in support of the 33rd Marine Amphibious Unit. A report of HMM-165's operational activities is contained in the monthly chronology of the 33rd MAU.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of November, Marine Aircraft Group 36 was inspected by the Inspector General, Marine Corps, Major General CARL. All phases of training and administration were inspected including troop functions and aircraft maintenance. Aviation assets of the Group were utilized in support of the inspection team during their stay on Okinawa.

Plans for the United Kingdom/United States Aviation Personnel Exchange Program were firmed during a visit to Hong Kong by Colonel MALONEY, Commanding Officer, MAG-36. The exchange program was further developed by Captain BURNS, MAG-36 and Major UNGER, III MAF G-3.
