



PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

(C) Throughout the month of November 1972, HMM-164, attached to the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit, remained embarked aboard the USS OKINAWA with fourteen CH-46's, six CH-53's, and four UH-1E's. The report of their operational activities is contained in the monthly chronology of the 31st MAU.

(C) HMM-165, with thirteen CH-46's, six CH-53's, and four UH-1E's remained embarked aboard the USS NEW ORLEANS, in support of the 33rd Marine Amphibious Unit. A report of HMM-165's operational activities is contained in the monthly chronology of the 33rd MAU.

(C) Aboard the USS CLEVELAND, HMA-369, with seven AH-1J's continued its interdiction role for MARHUK operations. A resume of HMA-369's operations for the month of November will be found in the 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade Monthly Chronology, and HMA-369 message 070830Z Dec 72 (S).

(C) H&MS-36 Detachment Delta, with four CH-46's, continued to provide SAR/Medevac, logistic and security support for Task Force Delta at Nam Phong, Thailand, as well as administrative/liaison support for MAG-15.

(C) HMH-462, with six CH-53's assigned, provided logistic support to MAG-36 with three aircraft, maintained two aircraft on assignment to the Atomic Energy Commission in the Marshall Islands for radiation testing, and placed one aircraft in rework at Tainan, Taiwan. Of the 175.2 hours flown in November by HMH-462, 72.4 were in support of the AEC at Eniwetok Island, with the remainder being divided between support of Okinawa-based units and the IGMCI Inspection Team.

(C) VMGR-152, augmented for the first half of November by one aircraft from VMGR-352, continued to support SEA Operations with 335.8 flight hours. Squadron support of VMCI-1 ECM Operations at NAS, Cubi Point, R.P., continued with one KC-130F in daily use. A detailed summary of squadron activities is located in Tab I, exclusive of VMGR-152 Det Delta's operations, which may be found in the monthly chronology of Task Force Delta.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of November, Marine Aircraft Group 36 was inspected by the Inspector General, Marine Corps, Major General CARL. All phases of training and administration were inspected including troop functions and aircraft maintenance. Aviation assets of the Group were utilized in support of the inspection team during their stay on Okinawa.

Plans for the United Kingdom/United States Aviation Personnel Exchange Program were firmed during a visit to Hong Kong by Colonel MALONEY, Commanding Officer, MAG-36. The exchange program was further developed by Captain BURNS, MAG-36 and Major UNGER, III MAF G-3.

Planning was initiated into the further development of Battalion Landing Team training prior to going afloat, with the resultant development of training objectives and requirements, and aviation inputs.

Representatives of MAG-36 and 3dFSR commenced the initial planning for an Emergency Evacuation Plan for Camp Hansen, discussing needed aviation and personnel requirements.

Preparations are being made to increase the training capability of the MAG-36 Training and Orientation School, with classes of record numbers being taught at the present time.

Major G. G. KEMP, MAG-36 S-3 and Major R. L. NEFF, MAG-36 Assistant S-3, met with representatives of MCAS(H) Futema and Kadena Air Force Base to discuss the flight restrictions and administrative requirements for aircraft flying between MCAS(H) Futema and Kadena AFB.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 2 November support was provided to deploy to Eniwetok Island a HMH-462 Detachment consisting of two CH-53D's. Logistic support was provided during deployment. The two CH-53's were embarked aboard the USS RANGER on 23 November 1972 for retrograde. They are presently in Cubi Point P. I. awaiting return to Futema. The additional personnel and logistic support returned to Futema on 25 November via Air Force PATMA Flight.

An I. G. Inspection was conducted from 9-11 November. The following areas cognizant to S-4 were inspected: Logistic Files, Supply (MCP, Naval Supply, and Warehouse), Heavy Equipment and Motor Transport. No written reports have been received, however a Satisfactory with Minor Discrepancies is expected.
