

7. Motor Transport

a. Operations. MAG-36 Motor Transport Vehicles traveled 39,536
 miles. Approximately 330,000 gallons of water was delivered to MAG-36
 units for showers, mess halls, and drinking purposes. 34,000 gallons

of fuel was delivered to Quang Ngai and Tam Ky and 320,655 gallons was delivered to TAFDS at Ky Ha. MAG-36 used 18,000 gallons of MOGAS. Diesel delivered to and used by MAG-36 amounted to 720,000 gallons.

b. There were no accidents during this period.

c. 158 work orders were completed with 23 remaining open at this time.

8. Materiel. The Materiel Section continued to perform routine duties during December. The large number of personnel joined necessitated above averages of individual equipment.
