

## 7. Motor Transport

a. Operations. MAG-36 Motor Transport vehicles traveled 45,933 miles. Approximately 308,000 gallons of drinking water was delivered to MAG-36 units and MASS-3 for showers, messhalls. 206,000 gallons of fuel were delivered to Quang Ngai during this period. 142,304 gallons of Aviation Gas and 394,608 gallons of Jet Fuel were delivered to TAFDS during this period. MAG-36 used 32,000 gallons of Mogas. Diesel fuel delivered to and used by MAG-36 amounted to 47,200 gallons.

b. There were no accidents during this period.

c. 149 work orders have been completed with 40 work orders outstanding.
