Fuel delivered to Quang Ngai totaled 35,000 gallons and 13,200 gallons to Tam Ky. Fuel delivered to TAFDS units, JP-4 205,937 gallons, AV/Gas 131,794 gallons. MO gas 36,000 gallons and 72,000 gallons of desiel have been hauled during the period covered. There have been no vehicle accidents during the month of April 1967.
