

6. Communications

a. 18-26 July 1967 - Landing Zone Control Team (2 radio operators) deployed with Helicopter Support Team, 1st Shore Party Bn. in support of the 1st Bn., 7th Marines on Operation Pecos.

b. 18-26 July 1967 - 1 Logistics Support Team (2 radio operators) deployed with, "C" Co. 1st Shore Party Bn, in support of the 7th Marines on Operation Pecos.

f. 1-31 July 1967 - Total message traffic processed by MAG-36 Communications Center was 4,899 incoming and 1,313 outgoing messages.

7. Motor Transport

a. One building 20' x 30' was roofed and painted and is now in use for our body shop personnel.

b. One area 20' x 16' was cleared and leveled for a shower house. A wooden form was constructed 20' x 16' for a cement foundation. Cement was laid and preparations made for a wooden structure for frame work.

c. The 2d Echelon Shop had two sections dug out by hand for laying of cement. One section 26'x49' and one section 25'x39' was cleared and leveled for laying of cement. A total of 48 cubic yards of cement was poured to complete all the available shop space for the 2d Echelon Shop.

d. Six troop living buildings were painted, ^sone tire shop, one operations building and one maintenance office building.

f. During the period concerned the vehicles of MAG-36 have traveled some 33,955 miles. Water hauled and delivered for, mess hall, showers, and drinking purposes amounted to 588,000 callons. Also during this period the water trucks of MABS-36 have supported FLSG-B and 7th Comm. Bn in supplying water on a daily basis.

g. JP-4 hauled for TAFDS units amounted to 113,450 with 121,450 gallons of 115/145.

i. Diesel hauled and used by MAG-36 amounted to 49,600 gallons with 55,800 gallons of Mo Gas used during this period.

8. Materiel Section

a. In addition to performing the routine duties inherent to the mission of supply during the month of July, this section had a security cage erected and all pilferageable items were then secured therein.
