

3. General

- a. During March 1968, food services fed an average of 1100 men per meal. Considered especially noteworthy in a mess hall designed to accomodate only 200 men.
- b. TAFDS, Quang Tri, disposed 99,837 gallons of aviation gas and 393,985 gallons of VP-4 fuel.
- c. Utilities provided the normal base services and condidered noteworthy is the over 2,000,000 gallons of pure water furnished to MAC-36 and neighboring ground elements.
