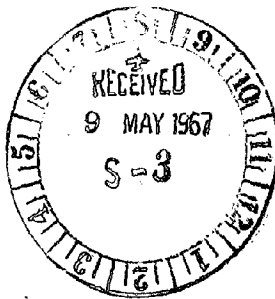

## 3. Summary of Significant Events

a. Squadron. (U) On 30 April 1967 the squadron redeployed 6 aircraft from NAF Naha to MCAF Iwakuni. VMGR-152 transported 109 enlisted and 18 officers.

b. Personnel. (U) Five Naval Aviators and nine Naval Flight Officers were joined from MAG-15. One Naval Aviator and two Naval Flight Officers were transferred. Enlisted strength increased slightly.

c. Awards. (U) No awards were presented during this period.

d. Air Operations.(C) During the report period VMFA-115 recorded 326.7 flight hours and 289 sorties. Missions included 136 Bombs and Rockets, 11 Night Bombs and Rockets/Air Refueling, 11 Day Air Refueling, 20 Night Air Refueling, 10 Helicopter Escorts, 24 Close Air Support, and 22 Tactical Weapons Sorties. Ordnance expended included 322 MK-81, 229 2.75" RRAR, 244 ZUNI's, 90 MK-82, 51 MK-76, 58 MK-77, and 94 MK-24, mod 3 flares. The squadron supported two exercises during the report period, PHIBLEX "Beach Baron I" and "Hill Top VII". Flight operations were hampered by poor weather.

e. During the month approximately 840 man hours of aircrew and 1200 man hours of technical training was conducted. Pistol and rifle requalifications and familiarization were conducted resulting in 40 personnel requalifying with the 45", 49 personnel requalifying with the 38" and 152 personnel fam firing the M-14.
