NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the month of September, VMEN-152 flew 1397 hours in 730 sorties. Of these 1311.4 hours and 665 sorties were flown in support of the IIIMMerimeAmphibéous Force in RVN.
- 2. Logistics commitments consisted of airlifting cargo and passengers between Okinawa and DaNang, DaNang, Cubi Foint and Hong Kong, and between the various airfields within the I Corps Tactical Zone of Operations. The total number of passengers transported was 20,885; cargo totals for the month show 1,684 tons.
- 3. Night illumination for ground forces in the ICTC was provided nightly, from sunset to surise, by flare configured aircraft from the Squadron. There were 56 Flare Missions flown; 5,463 flares were dispensed.
- 4. Aerial refueling was provided for 297 aircraft during the month. This was accomplished on 80 tanker sorties flown as routine on station tanker missions out of DaNang, and refueling Marine fighter aircraft supporting the 7th fleet in LARCAP Operations on Yankee Station. A total of 266,738 gallons of fuel was dispensed during this months tanker operations.

1. COMMITMENTS

- A. 5 Sept The on station tember in RVM, in response to a call on guard channel from an Air America C-47 with one engine out, located the distressed aircraft 100 miles out to sea off Danang, and escerted him to a safe landing at Danang.
- B. 19 Sept Transported CG III MAF from Danang to Quang Tri and return. Transportation via squadron sircraft was requested because weather was too poor for any other means of transportation.
 - C. 23 Sept Asst. CG III MAF was transported from Hong Keng to Danang.
 - D. 24 Sept Asst. CG latMAW was flown from Quang Tri to Danang.
- E. 25-26 Sept The Island of Okinawa was placed in Typhoon Condition II when Typhoon Elsie appeared to be aimed directly at the Island with winds foreast to be 150 knots. Squadren aircraft were evacuated to Iwakuni, Japan and returned to Ukinawa on the evening of 26 Sept when the typhoon changed to a westerly course.
- F. 28,29,30 Sept With only two hours notice, a priority airlift of some one thousand troops of the Third Marine Division from Quang Tri, RVN to Okinawa was initiated. The lift was completed in two and one-half days by an around the cleck shuttle of four squadron aircraft.
