PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 6 October 1972, LtCol. H. C. IVY, Commanding, cited a message from General CUSHMAN, Commandant, congratulating the "Silver Eagles" on being selected to receive the Robert M. HANSEN Award as the "Number 1" fighter squadron in the Marine Corps. As this news was passed to all hands it was a visible morale booster for all personnel.

(C) During October, the "Silver Eagles" continued to fly daily Barrier Combat Air Patrols (BARCAP) in support of U. S. operations against North Vietnam. Through training, more crews were qualified for BARCAP missions, and those already qualified kept proficient by conducting air combat maneuvering training on the return leg of these missions "North". On 24 October 1972, the BARCAP mission was terminated by higher headquarters in conjunction with cessation of strikes above the 20th parallel. The last Marines and "Silver Eagles" to fly the BARCAP on 22 October 1972 were: Captain Kevin O'MARA and Captain Robert RENIER, Flight Leader; Major Jay BIBLER and Captain Mel JOHNSON, Wingman; and Captain Joe ANDERSON and Captain James BALLARD, Airborne backup.

(C) VIFA-115 continued to support the South Vietnamese forces with Close Air Support and Direct Air Support missions in Military Region I, Military Region II, and the Steel Tiger and Barrel Roll areas in Laos.

(C) VIFA-115 flew 447.6 combat hours and dropped 449.4 tons of ordnance. This rate shows an increase of 10 hours/140 tons over September, but ordnance tonnage remained significantly below the pre-BARCAP months.
