NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May, VMA-121 continued combat air operations from Marine Corps Air Station, Chu Lei, RVN in Support of the RVN. Flying conditions were excellent throughout the month. VMA-121 provided extensive air support to Operations Hickory, Union and in the Khe Sanh area. A total of 1478.4 flight hours and 1125 sorties were flown of which 1460.0 hours and 1107 sorties were combat missions. Night combat missions accounted for 267 flight hours.

1756.89 tons of ordnance were expended during the period resulting in the following Battle Damage Assessment (BDA):

The other sustained no injury. 1stLt. Michael W. THOENNES was KIA on 30 May 1%7. Captain George C. ROMANO was WIA after his aircraft was shot down on 11 May 1%7
