## MARRATIVE SUMMARY

During January, VMA-121 flew 1219.6 hours and 1033 sorties of which 1187.4 hours and 1003 sorties were combat missions. Since 22 January, VMA-121 has flown extensive air operations in support of Operation SCOTLAND (26th Marines) in the Khe Sanh area. A total of 166 combat sorties and 222 tons of aviation ordnance were dropped during the 10 day period. Of the total sorties flown by VMA-121, 254 sorties were given battle damage assessment by the controlling agency.

The squadron delivered 1676.76 tons of aviation ordnance with the highest daily total being 84.60 tons.

At approximately 0410 on 31 January communist insurgent forces initiated a rocket and mortar attack on Chu Lai Air Base. The Force Logistic Command Bomb Dump took a hit in one of the revetments setting off a large secondary explosion. As a result of this explosion the VMA-121 hangar and working spaces were substantially damaged, however, only two aircraft were damaged beyond the capability of squadron level maintenance. There were no personnel casualties.
