MARRATIVE SUMMARY

During Nay, WiA-121 flew 1092.1 hours and 1061 sorties of which 1066.7 hours and 1031 sorties were flown in support of combat operations in the Republic of Vietnam. The Squadron delivered 1740.54 tons of aviation ordnance with the highest daily total being 93.12 tons on 10 May 1968.

During a one week period, 5 - 11 May, WAA-121 flew 336.1 combat hours and 333 combat sorties while delivering 497 tons of aviation ordnance. The high single day during this period was 58.4 hours and 59 sorties.

Of the 1031 combat sorties flown during May, 371 sorties were given battle damage assessment by the controlling agency. The following lists the reported BDA:
