

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of June the "Silver Eagles" of VMFA-115 flew 498 combat sorties in support of operations throughout the I Corps, II Corps, Barrier Combat Air Patrols over the Gulf of Tonkin in support of the 7th Fleet, and Bomber Escort Missions, generally over Laos in support of the 7th Air Force.

Operations supported by the Officers and Men of VMFA-115 included Texas Star, Green River, Fredrick Hill, Iron Mountain, and Geneva Park. Units receiving scheduled or on call Close Air Support included, the First Marine Division, 5th, 7th, and 17th Infantry Army, 24th Corps U. S. Army, Special Forces, 1st Recon Battalion, Americal Division, 7th Air Force, ROK Marines, and ARVN Forces. These included Close Air Support Barrier Cap, TIC Cap, Direct Air Support, Escort, and Air to Ground Hot Pad launches.

On 8 June, 2 F4B's of the "Silver Eagles" launched as Love Bug 215 in support of the 1st ARVN. The crews consisted of Captain C. MADSIN - (Pilot), 1stLt M. S. L. M. EIC- (RIO), Captain J. K. FRENCH - (Pilot), 1stLt J. K. RAITREL - (RIO) carrying D2A and D9 bombs. With accurate ordnance delivery the flight accounted for 23 enemy troops killed by Marine Air (confirmed).

Bomb Damage Assessment for the month of June included 24 enemy killed 34 structures destroyed and 15 damaged, 101 bunkers destroyed and 15 damaged, 22 secondary explosions, 31 secondary fires, 7 fighting positions destroyed, 205 meters of tree line destroyed, 100 meters of trench line destroyed and 7 trail cuts.

During the month of June, VMFA-115 dropped 1113.6 tons of ordnance on the insurgent enemy forces for an average daily tonage of just over 37.1 tons.

i. Air Support.

(1) During the month of June, Capt C. S. TUTT and C. MADSEN flew their 200th combat mission. Also achieving their 200th mission were Lt's R. A. GIBBAC, G. L. MCGAUGHEY, S. R. MUSLIHEC, and J. L. HIERSCHE. Reaching the 100 mission mark were Lt's R. L. NISE and J. E. ELLSON.

(2) Air Defense.

(a) The "Silver Eagles" of VFA-115 flew 7 Barrier Combat Air Patrol missions over the Gulf of Tonkin and 22 Bomber Escort Missions were flown generally over Laos. No MIG contacts were made.
