PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of July the "Silver Eagles" of VMFA-115 flew 469 combat sorties in support of operations throughout I Crops and II Corps areas, Barrier Combat Air Patrols over the Gulf of Tonkin in support of the 7th Fleet, and Bomber Escort Missions, generally over Laos in support of the 7th Air Force.


Significant operations supported by the Officers and men of VMFA-115 included Texas Star, Geneva Park, Frederick Hill, Iron Mountain, and Green River. Units receiving scheduled or on call air support included the First Marine Division, 1st Recon Battalion, 5th, 7th, and 17th Infantry Army, 24th Corps U. S. Army, Special Forces, Americal Division, 101st Airborne, ROK Marine, ARVN Forces, 7th Air Force, and U. S. 7th Fleet. These included Close Air Support, Barrier Cap, MIG Cap, direct Air Support and Air to Ground Hot Pad Launches.

On 3 July 2 FhB's of VMFA-115 launched from the hot pad on a Close Air Support mission as Lovebug 212, carrying D2A's and D9's. The flight was flown in support of the First Marine Division by Major R. L. HANLE - (Pilot), Major C. R. FAIRCHILD - (RIO) and lstLt. W. S. PANCHISON - (Pilot), lstLt. M. B. SANDBERG - (RIO) and controlled by "Hostage Bill". With accurate ordnance delivery the flight accounted for 2 enemy troops killed by Marine Air (confirmed).

Again on 18 July VMFA-115 launched a flight of 2 F4B's from the air to ground hot pad as Lovebug 221. The flight carried D2A's and D9's on a close air support mission in support of ARVN Forces. The crews consisted of Captain C. MADSEN - (Pilot), lstLt. B. F. ROBINSON - (RIO), and lstLt. G. A. ZAHN Jr. - (Pilot), lstLt. R. E. LINK - (RIO). Helix control reported by phone the next day that 2 enemy troops had been killed by the flight's accurate ordnance delivery on a tree line south of Chu Lai.

Captain C. S. TUTT - (Pilot), lstLt. J. L. WITTER - (RIO), and lstLt. W. L. STEVENS - (Pilot), lstLt. S. M. SILVER launched on a close air support mission as Lovebug 502 on 29 July carrying D3DC's in support of the lolst Airborne. These 2 F4B's of the "Silver Eagles" were credited with 17 enemy troops killed by Bilk 16 in a phone call on 30 July. The devastating results of this mission attest to the accurate ordnance delivery and professionalism of the Officers and men of VMFA-115.

Bomb Damage Assessment for the month of July included 2 confirmed enemy killed, 19 probable enemy killed, 46 structures destroyed, 15 structures damaged, 74 bunkers destroyed, 10 bunkers damaged, 35 secondary explosions, 54 secondary fires, 4 fighting positions destroyed, 795 meters



of tree line destroyed, 3 foot bridges destroyed, 2 tunnels destroyed, and 1 arms cache destroyed.

During the month of July, VMFA-115 dropped 1005.7 tons of ordnance on the insurgent enemy forces for an average daily tonnage of just over 32.4 tons. Expended ordnance was 2925 MK-82 500 pound bombs, 320 MK-83 1000 pound bombs, and 494 MK-77 500 pound firebombs.

July saw a change of command on the twenty-second, with LtCol. J. V. COX passing the VMFA-115 colors to LtCol. M. MURA. LtCol. COX moved up to Executive Officer of MAG-13.



i. Air Support.
