#### PART II

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May VMGR-152 flew 946 sorties for a total of 1883 flight hours. The average sortie was of 2.0 duration. During the month VMGR-152 transported 23,490 passengers and 3,707 short tons of cargo. The number of Aerial Refueling missions increased by over 100%-from 25 to 52-and the number of aircraft refueled increased by over 130%-from 69 to 161.

The Sub Unit based at Da Nang continued to operate an average of four aircraft in support of "in-country" operations. These operations, again, consisted of aerial refueling, logistical resupply and flare drop missions. Flare drop missions increased by more than 100% from 33 to 68, this month, and the number of flares dispensed increased from 5041 to 9389.

#### SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

### 1. Commitments

A review of the commitments flown during May shows the following significant events, in chronological order.

- 2 May
  - a. A4E aircraft split refueling hose. Ingested fuel, flamed out and ejection followed. C-130 flew RESCAP.
- 3 May
  - a. Dropped flares in support of ground troops assaulting hills 881N and 881S. This crew acted as TACA during mortar attack at Lang Vie.
- 4 May
  - a. Provided transportation for BGen KELLER and party Da Nang to Khe Sanh to witness 3/3 assaulting 881.
  - b. Detachment A/C hit by ground fire on T.O. from Hue. Two passengers received minor wounds.
- 6 May
  - a. Lifted Battalion of 937 men and 4 loads of vehicles from Da Nang to Hue in 5 hours.
  - b. Provided transportation from Atsugi to Iwakuni for MGen BOUKER.
- 8 May
  - a. Three emergency MedEvac flights in RVN.
- 9 May
  - a. F4B broke off end of refueling drogue, causing fire in right hand refueling pod. Refueling pod required replacement.
- ll May
  - a. Battalion airlift from Hue to Khe Sanh and Dong Ha.
- 12 May
  - a. Aircraft received 2 hits during flare drop mission in A Shau Valley.
- 14 May
  - a. Aircraft received 6 hits by 12.7mm automatic weapon while on Aerial Delivery mission. Radio Operator received slight wound in wrist.

b. Air struck by lightening during climb out for refueling mission.

#### 15 May

- a. Aircraft received 3 hits by 12.7mm automatic weapon while on Aerial Delivery mission. Same place as Aerial Delivery mission on 14 May.
- b. Aircraft to night refueling standby at 18°30'N 20 miles off the coast of NVN.

#### 17 May

a. Aircraft received 9 hits by 30 cal. fire during approach to Quang Ngai airport.

#### 18 May

a. Runway at Khe Sanh came apart when KC-130 landed. Field is marginal at best.
