

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During June VMGR-152 flew a decreased number of both hours and sorties from the FY 67 high reached in May. This is attributed to the relative lessening of hostilities throughout I Corps, RVN during this period. The squadron flew 1591 hours on 818 sorties for an average sortie length of 1.9. 2325 tons of cargo and 18,905 passengers were transported to, from and within RVN. Aerial Refueling missions again increased from 52 to 66. This month 131 aircraft were refueled vice 161 during May.

The Sub Unit based at Da Nang operated an average of three aircraft this month following an ordered decrease by CG FMFPAC. The missions flown consisted of aerial refueling, logistics and flare drop missions. Both flare missions and number of flares dispensed decreased sharply this month due to a shortage of flares and the reduced activity in I Corps.
