NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of November, VMGR-152 flew 1,100 sorties for a total of 1,497 flight hours. 25,509 passengers and 3,293 short tons of cargo were transported.

The Sub Unit based at Danang continued to operate with an average of four aircraft. Missions flown consisted of aerial refueling, logistics, air delivery and flare drop missions.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Commitments

A review of the commitments flown during November shows the following significant events in chronological order.

- 1 November a. 147572 Crew: Major N. DE SIO, and Capt. S. A. DUTCHER On takeoff at Danang airfield, RVN, a small caliber bullet passed through the port elevator.
- b. Provided transportation for Gen GLICK from Atsugi to Iwakuni c. Provided transportation for Col SHOOK from Futema to Iwakuni to Atsugi to Iwakuni.
- 11 November a. 148893 Crew: Major M. B. LYNCH, and 1/Lt. D. M. JONTZ During a shuttle between Hue Phu Bai airfield, RVN, and Dong Ha airfield, one small caliber round passed through the vertical stabilizer.
- b. During a landing approach to Hue Phu Bai airport on the morning of 11 November 1967 aircraft number 148247 was hit by an enemy small arms round that penetrated the fuel heater on the number 4 engine. This allowed fuel to drain into the engine nacelle. The crew was not aware of the bullet hit until the plane was on the runway and the propellers were reversed. At this time the number 4 engine nacelle exploded and the ensuing fire caused extensive damage to the engine, propeller and wing behind the engine before the airfield fire trucks extinguished the flames. The engine and propeller were replaced and the holes that had been burned in the wing and flaps were patched so that the plane could be flown to Osaka, Japan where it is now awaiting a new outer wing to be installed by a Japanese aircraft company. The pilots were Major F. T. O'CONNOR and Major W. S. BALDWIN. There were no injuries to personnel.
- 14 November a. 148895 Crew: Major J. K. KNOPE, and Major J. F. WALSH In the vacinity of Hue Phu Bai airport, RVN, one small caliber round punctured the leading edge and the number four fuel cell.
- 15 November a. 148893 Crew: LtCol R. M. WILLIAMS, and Major H. CLAYSON Six nautical miles east of An Hoa airfield, RVN, one round of enemy small arms fire penetrated the cargo compartment deck and hit an overhead compartment dome light. The round missed an ammunition pallet by 14 inches.
- 17 November a. 150688 Crew: Major R. K. GOFORTH, and Major R. F. DAAS On approach to Quang Tri airfield, RVN, aircraft was struck twice by enemy small arms fire. One round struck the number two propeller, three and one half inches from blade root. Another round hit the aircraft just below the port wing root, and continued through the top of the cargo compartment.
- b. Evacuated all squadron aircraft from Futema to Danang, Osaka, Iwakuni, Atsugi, and Cubi Point due to Typhoon Gilda.
- 20 November a. All squadron aircraft returned to Futema after all clear on Typhoon Gilda.
- 30 November a. Provided transportation for Col KELIOG from Danang to Futema.
