## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of June, VMGR-152 flew 943 sorties for a total of 1,758 flight hours. 31,304 passengers and 4,192 short tons of cargo were transported.

The sub unit based at Danang continued to operate with an average of four aircraft. Missions flown consisted of aerial refueling, logistics, and flare drop missions.

## PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Commitments

A review of the commitments flown during June shows the following significant events in chronological order.

- 5 June a. Provided transportation for Gen CHIP from Danang to Dong Ha.
- 6 June a. Provided transportation for Col THOMAS (Chief of Staff, 1stMAW) from Danang to Futema.
- 7 June a. Provided transportation for Col KELLOGG from Danang to Futema.
- 12 June a. Provided transportation for Col KELLOGG from Futema to Iwakuni.
- 13 June a. Provided transportation for Col THOMAS from Danang to Futema via Taipei.
- 16 June a. 148890 - Crew: Major KNOPE and Captain LARSON - On flight to AN HOA received small arms fire, taking 5 hits. One round each in left wing, left side of fuselage aft of paratroop door, left elevator, right front main tire, and right air deflector. Made landing without incident.
- 18 June a. Provided transportation for BGen KIM (KMC) from Hong Kong to Danang.
- 21 June a. 149811 - Crew: Major ALLEN and Major BURROWS - Provided flare drop for "Jolly Green Giant" in attempted med evac, from off-shore boat to hospital ship. Med evac was unsuccessful.
- 27 June a. Provided transportation for BGen HILL from Danang to Quang Tri.
- b. Provided transportation for Wing Band from Danang to Quang Tri.
