NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the month of August, VMGR-152 flew 1412 hours in 723 sorties. Of these, 1333 hours and 712 sorties were in direct support of the III Marine Amphibious Force in RVN.
- 2. Logistics commitments consisted of air transportation of cargo and passengers between Okinawa and DaNang, DaNang, Cubi Point and Hong Kong, and in and out of the various airfields in I Corps Tactical Zone of Operations. The total number of passengers transported was 20,976; cargo totals for the month show 2307 tons.
- 3. Night illumination for ground forces in the ICTZ was provided nightly with a flare ship on station from sunset to sunup. There were 61 flare missions flown on which 7,042 flares were dispensed.
- 4. Aerial refueling was provided for 484 aircraft during the month. This was accomplished on 103 KC-130F sorties flown as normal day tanker missions out of DaNang, and refueling Marine fighter aircraft supporting the 7th Fleet in BARCAP Operations. A total of 428,694 gallons of fuel was dispensed. In addition to active tanker missions, inflight refueling training was provided for VMFA-122 prior to that squadron's deployment to RVN.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. COMMITMENTS

- A. 11-15 Aug, 18-22 Aug VMGR-152 hosted two 9thMAB ALO/FAC schools. The first school was attended by 44 students, the second by 37 students.
- B. 18-21 Aug The advance toward Okinawa of Typhoon Cora caused the evacuation of all Okinawa based VMGR-152 aircraft. Within 4 hours after receipt of the evacuation order, all eight aircraft were airborne, and subsequently landed at MCAS Iwakuni, Japan, the designated evacuation haven. While at MCAS Iwakuni several aircraft engaged an inflight refueling training for VMFA-122. All aircraft returned to MCAF Futema on 21 August, shortly after the all clear was given. Squadron assets on board MCAF Futema suffered only light damage from the typhoon, which passed some 20 miles west of the field with peak wind gusts of 90 knots.
- C. 31 Aug A squadron change of command was held in which LtCOL. A. H. MANHARD Jr. assumed command of VMGR-152 from LtCOL. F. R. SMOKE, relieved.
