NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the period 1 January to 14 April 1971, VMGR-152 flew 3,440 hours in 1,223 sorties.
- 2. Logistics commitments consisted of airlifting cargo and passengers between Okinawa and Danang; Danang, Cubi Point, and Hong Kong; between the various airfields within the I Corps Tactical Zone of operations; and between Futema, Iwakuni and Atsugi. The total number of passengers transported was 17,473; cargo totals for this period show 3,458 tons were transported.
- 3. Night illumination was provided nightly on a stand-by basis, from sunset to sunrise for ground forces in the I Corps Tactical Zone by flare configured aircraft from this squadron. There were 140 flare missions flown and 5,298 flares dropped for this period.
- 4. Aerial refueling was provided for 381 aircraft during this period. This was accomplished on 165 sorties flown as routine on-station and stand-by tanker missions out of Danang. 168,543 gallons of fuel were dispensed.
