

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1 June 1965 - Continuing daily commitments as normal: 8 A/C were assigned for RLT-4 support, 2 to 4 for MARLOG twice daily, 2 for Chu Lai SAR and 2 on condition 4 standby. 2 Med Evacs were lifted from LZ Wren (531003) to BLT 1/4 BSA and 1 Med Evac from "B" Med to LPH-2. 2 A/C were down, AOCF for tail rotor blades. (The loose sand in many of the landing zones in the Chu Lai area caused abnormal wear on the tail rotor blades.)

2 June 1965 - Normal daily commitments were accomplished. 1 RLT-4 Med Evac and 1 BLT 1/4 Med Evac were lifted to "B" Med. 1 ARVN WIA was evacuated from 413120 to Tam Ky. This pickup was accomplished under hostile ground fire, and two Squadron A/C were hit. 500 rounds were expended from the helo's M-60's in suppression of the hostile ground fire. BuNo 145751, Pilot Capt R. G. MILLER, received one round in the port side at Sta 423.4, water line 30.2. BuNo 148794, pilot Capt J. M. COYKENDALL, received one round at Sta 340.5, stbd side, water line 75. There were no injuries to personnel.

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6 June 1965 - Continued normal RLT-4 support. Two squadron aircraft and crews were lost in an aircraft accident which occurred at 0510H. Launched from LPH-2 for a pre-dawn SAR mission, the two helicopters apparently collided in midair and fell to the sea. The accident claimed the lives of eight squadron members: Capt P. F. MCNALLY, 1stLt A. C. HERTZ, 1stLt G. O. MCKAY, 1stLt N. A. DOEDEN, Cpl F. W. WILSON, Cpl G. D. TRACY, LCpl C. B. MCBEE and PFC C. L. FOSTER (see messages 061559Z, 061630Z, 061650, 061658Z, 061701Z and 061604, 061645, 070518Z). May their souls rest in peace. 1 Marine WIA was lifted from 607000 to the BLT 3/3 BSA, 1 from 541994 to "B" Med, 1 from "B" Med to LPH-2, 1 from 531001 to BLT 1/4 BSA and 6 from LPH-2 to Da Nang.

Four missions were flown during the afternoon while the squadron was setting up base camp: (1) 2 A/C delivered four barrels of 115/145 AVGas from Phu Bai to Quang Tri. (2) The first group of squadron personnel for R and R were taken to Da Nang. (3) An area recon sighted suspected VC running at 885076 and notified BLT 3/4 and subsequently 28 Marines were lifted into the area. They were surrounded and captured for search and interrogation. (4) An "Eagle" flight of ten aircraft was launched to Hue Citadel for a briefing and subsequent retrograde of ARVN troops from Nam Dong (YC876845) to Khe Tri (YC912895).

13 June 1965 - The Squadron commenced daily operations from the new Camp Base at Hue Phu Bai. The normal daily commitments will be: resupply and med evacs for BLT 3/4, AM and PM MARLOG flights from Hue Phu Bai to Da Nang to Chu Lai to Da Nang to Hue Phu Bai in support of the 3rd MAF. One sick Marine was evacuated from 816117 and another from 809093 to "B" med at Hue Phu Bai. Six squadron helicopters supported by two HU-1B's lifted 330 troops and 15,000 pounds of cargo for the First ARVN Division from Hue Phu Bai to 910890 (Khe Tra). Two aircraft lifted 49 Marines from Phu Bai to 8609 in a combination troop lift and Dawn Patrol. Eight aircraft supported by two Army HU-1B's lifted 167 ARVN troops from 6641 to Hue Citadel on a planned retrograde.

This brings the total aircraft inventory to 23 UH-34D's. Six aircraft supported an ARVN strike in conjunction with HMM-365 from Da Nang to 855845. 32 ARVNS were lifted from Da Nang to coord. 855845. The aircraft then reverted to standby for fast reaction. Three Marines were lifted from Da Nang to RVN District HQ (934695) and two SeaBee's from Da Nang to Monkey Mt. (115832) for an on site survey in conjunction with a construction survey. One aircraft accompanied HMM-365 aircraft on a resupply to LZ Turkey (946775) and coord 855838. One aircraft carried three Marines WIA from 855845 to Da Nang. Two sick Marines from BLT 3/4 were lifted from YD 877075 and another from YD849085, all were taken to "B" Med. at Hue Phu Bai. Four aircraft flew a support mission for RLT-4 at Chu Lai and carried five civilian and one ARVN Med Evacs from 488034 to TamKy.

A second wave of 271 troops of the 3rd Battalion ARVN were lifted from PK-17 to YD 583244. All aircraft returned to Hue Phu Bai at 1030. There was no ordnance expended, no incidents and no injuries occurred, due to excellent landing zone preparation and air cover.

One sick Marine of BLT 3/4 was lifted from YD 893089 to "B" Med. An ARVN company in place relief was flown with 4 aircraft between Hue Citadel and YD 634426. The quick reaction platoon of BLT 3/4 was lifted from BLT CP to 852088. An ARVN resupply was flown from La Vang (YD 340507) to Ca Lu (YD 008455). Two artillery F.O.'s were flown around grid square 8092 after reports of VC activity in this area. No activity was noted.

The dusk patrol received automatic weapons fire one-thousand meters north-east of Hue Phu Bai, neither aircraft was hit.

An ARVN resupply was flown from PK-17 to YD 605397, and another from Dong Ha (245605) to Ca Lu (YD 009452 and D-5 YD 095525).

29 June 1965 - BGen KARCH was flown from Chu Lai to Da Nang. The Dusk Patrol received small arms fire from 828045. Artillery cas called on small boats in the area, no hits were taken. One sick Marine was picked up at 820120 and another at Hill 225, both were dropped at "B" Med. Four aircraft were on standby at Da Nang to support HMM-365. Ten drums of AvGas were flown to Quang Tri and 20 empty brought back to Hue Phu Bai. Three BLT 3/4 Marines, wounded in action, were evacuated from 948674 to "B" Med. The pick up was made despite enemy small arms fire on the LZ. Three more Marines WIA and one VC prisoner were flown to "B" Med at Hue Phu Bai. Another flight of 2 aircraft was launched to drop 24 recon Marines at 835065. The patrol then requested to be retrograded due to strong VC contact in the area. It was subsequently discovered that two Marines were missing from the patrol. The flight returned for more men and aircraft to rescue the missing Marines. The flight, now consisting of 4 aircraft, dropped the reinforcements in the LZ and encountered heavy small arms fire. The helicopter gunners were credited with killing at least 2 VC. The flight returned the patrol to the BLT 3/4 CP, and it was noted that still another Marine was unaccounted for. The flight again returned to the LZ and rescued the missing Marine. Again the flight received heavy small arms fire and one mortar round landed 50 feet to the rear of YR-16. No hits were taken and the flight finally returned the entire patrol safely to Hue Phu Bai.

30 June 1965 - An A/O mission called a napalm strike on Hill 303. The daily MARLOG carried one Marine Med Evac to Da Nang. RLT 4 CO was picked up at Da Nang and flown to Hue Phu Bai and returned. Five sick Marines were evacuated from 830080 and another from 835075, all were dropped at "B" Med. Two Marines were evacuated from Hill 180 and another from 810070, all were taken to "B" Med. A strike mission utilized 15 squadron A/C to transport 171 Nungs to 620410, a LZ near BATO. The mission was accomplished very smoothly with Marine F4H's and A4B's providing excellent LZ preparation.

During the period 1 June thru 12 June 1965, the primary area of interest to the intelligence section was Chu Lai. On 12 June, HMM-161 was relocated to Hue Phu Bai.

Prior to 12 June, liaison was established with HMM-365, 3rd Battallion 4th Marines, and continued with MAG-16 (-) to familiarize the Squadron with the enemy situation in the Hue Phu Bai area.

Since relocation, Recon missions are flown daily at dawn and dusk with S-2 representatives from BLT 3/4 aboard. Cooperation between the S-2 section, pilots, and crew members, utilizing sighting reports and debriefings, continues to be a major source of information. In addition, ISUM's are received at least three times per week from Senior Advisor I Corps Da Nang, Senior Advisor 1st Infantry Division, Hue, 3rdMarDiv, 3rdMAF and 1stMAW.

To this date there have been no enemy probes of the Squadron area. The outer perimeter is the TAOR of the 3rdBn 4th Marines. The squadron provides its own internal security with nine (9) foxholes and one (1) road block.

There have been no aircraft hit by enemy fire during this period. Squadron aircraft have been fired upon on several occasions, and it is noteworthy that on two occasions night fire was received from villages to the north and east of Hue Phu Bai.
