Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 161 provided helicopter services for the Third Marine Division, the majority of which supported Operations DEWEY CANYON, SCOTLAND II, PEGLE MARTIN, and MAINE CRAIG. Supplementary services were also performed in support of the Army's 5th Mechanized Brigade.

Statistics: 8,166 troops/passengers carried, 553.8 tons of cargo transported, 883 personnel medically evacuated, 10 reconnaissance teams inserted, 8 teams extracted. This support resulted in 1287.0 flight hours, 3,454 sorties flown and 1,843 tasks accomplished. The squadron was flagged for 110 missions of which 107 were completed for a completion rate of 97%.

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PART III. Significant Events (C)

1 Mar - HMM-161 flew 56.9 flight hours despite low ceilings and poor visibility. Two aircraft performed 3 Recon inserts and extracts. Two VM0-6 aircraft provided cover while a third VM0-6 aircraft ran fixed wing in the area of (YD 175-085). The lead bird of HMM-161 extracted two teams that had been in contact for 3 days. They were extracted under poor weather conditions and hostile fire.

HMM-161 aircraft participated in a lift of approximately 180 ARVN troops making up a recon element plus their U. S. Advisors to the (14-98) grid in support of mission 203A. Two EAGLE CLAW gunships provided cover while three COVEY aircraft coordinated fixed wing support. All aircraft received fire with two HMM-161 aircraft taking hits. Three (3) crew members of the second aircraft received minor wounds. All aircraft were able to RIB while the damaged aircraft located a safe recovery area and landed. In spite of the fire incidents, poor weather conditions and unsatisfactory landing zones, the mission was completed.

2 Mar - HMM-161 operations were severely hampered by weather in the objective area. The weather lifted slightly in the late afternoon permitting 6 loads of external resupplies, and the medical evacuation of 21 Marines.

3 Mar - HMM-161 aircraft participated on a mission in support of Operation DEWEY CANYON flying 46.0 flight hours. 176 sorties were flown while 92 tasks were completed. The eight CH-46D's carried 5.3 tons of cargo with gun support provided by VM0-6. Insertion and extraction of 3 Recon teams and extraction of 1 Recon team were completed successfully. Two aircraft of HMM-161 launched on a Recon mission completing 18 sorties and 4 tasks. They inserted 3 Recon teams and extracted one. Gunship coverage was provided by VM0-6.

4 Mar - Squadron operations were again hampered by poor weather conditions. Two aircraft launched on an emergency Med-Evac to (ID 138-132). Supporting aircraft were of VMO-6 who provided airborne coverage. The ground element had been ambushed early that morning and had 9 emergencies, 2 priority and 1 Killed-in- Action. When the aircraft arrived on station, the ground forces were still in contact. The lead bird went into the zone and got all Med-Evacs on board and lifted out, taking fire most of the time and receiving one (1) hit. The chase aircraft then went into the zone with an emergency supply of ammunition. The aircraft took fire going into the zone and coming out but received no hits. completed.

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5 Mar - HMM-161 flew 25.6 flight hours completing 58 sorties, 19 tasks and carried 181 passengers and carried 1.0 tons of cargo in support of Operations DEWEY CANYON. Two CH-46D's completed 4 routine Recon inserts and three extracts. Supporting gunships were from VMO-6. Operations were limited due to deteriorating weather conditions.

6 Mar - HMM-161 flew a total of only 17.9 flight hours due to weather. In attempting to pick up priority passengers on an emergency resupply mission in support of Operation DEWEY CANYON, 1stLt T. H. POWELL was seriously wounded by one of two .50 caliber rounds which hit the aircraft. The co-pilot, Captain P. D. ALFORD flew the aircraft back to Quang Tri where he executed a GCA and delivered Lt. POWELL to the Third Medical Battalion.

Also while flying in support of Operation DEWEY CANYON, LtCol. D. L. ELAN (C.O. HMM-161) spotted an enemy mortar position which had been firing at the position he was resupplying. LtCol ELAN effectively silenced the mortar position with the use of his gunners and adjusted artillery with the result of two probable enemy KIA.

7 Mar - HMM-161 operations were again hampered by low ceilings and poor visibility. Four aircraft on a paradrop resupply mission in support of Operation DEWEY CANYON were able to spiral down through holes in the clouds and pick up Med-Evacs and priority passengers. While delivering a load in the (19-40) grid, one aircraft received heavy SAF and intense mortar fire in the zone, but sustained no hits or injury to the crew.

8 Mar - HMM-161 operations were again limited due to minimal weather.

9 Mar - A tactical troop lift for HMM-161 was cancelled due to bad weather. 10.8 flight hours were flown on Med-Evac missions in support of the Third Marine Division. A total of 9 casualties were evacuated to medical facilities.

10 Mar - HMM-161 launched two aircraft on a troop lift augmenting HMM-262 in order to lift a reconnaissance element out of the (16-00) grid. Supporting gunships were provided by VMO-6.

Two aircraft enroute to VANDERGRIFT Combat Base were diverted on an emergency Recon extract at (XD 825-606). The extract was made without incident. VMO-6 provided airborne cover.

11 Mar - HMM-161 operations were severely hampered by poor weather and visibility. One aircraft received .50 caliber and SAF from the (82-60) grid, taking hits in both stub wings. No injuries were sustained by the crew.

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12-13 Mar - Weather again hampered Squadron operations. Low ceilings and poor visibility left the field open to IFR traffic only.

14 Mar - HMM-161 launched 6 aircraft on resupply. At 1030H, 2 aircraft launched on an emergency resupply to LZ SIERRA. The aircraft were to also extract numerous Med-Evacs at the LZ. The lead aircraft piloted by LtCol. D. L. ELAM (C.O. HMM-161) and 1stLt. M. FINNERTY arrived at the position and dropped their resupply in the zone. While in the zone a mortar round hit the rear of the aircraft killing the Corporal aboard and seriously wounding the gunner and Crew Chief. The pilots were also slightly wounded. The aircraft caught fire and completely burned after all the crew were out of it. After staying at the LZ for over three hours during which time the position was under mortar attack, the survivors were evacuated by helicopter.

15 Mar - HMM-161 provided 6 aircraft for a tactical troop lift in support of Operation DEWEY CANYON. Flying 125 sorties in 54.9 flight hours the CH-46D's completed 69 tasks. They carried 481 troops and 17.1 tons of cargo. Supporting aircraft were two OV-10's of VMO-6.

16 Mar - IFR weather again hampered flight operations of this squadron.

17 Mar - HMM-161 launched 8 aircraft on a tactical troop lift in support of the Third Marine Division's Operation DEWEY CANYON. The aircraft were launched in IFR weather and instrument climbs were made to the tactical area. The aircraft flew a total of 23.0 flight hours and carried only 28 passengers due to severe weather.

18 Mar - HMM-161 aircraft participated in completing Operation DEWEY CANYON. 56 troops were extracted from the operational area along with 5 tons of cargo. All aircraft received fire at various times during the removal of troops. One aircraft was hit by two rounds of .50 caliber fire at (YD 955-655) while attempting to hoist Med-Evacs out of the zone. One gunner received minor injuries.

19 Mar - Today HMM-161 participated in an assault troop lift into LZ PHSSPORT (YD 797-228), with VMO-6 gunships and jet attack aircraft providing cover in support of Operation MAINE CRAIG. During the zone prep, attack aircraft destroyed one .50 caliber position. One CH-46D received one hit of SAF causing limited damage. 382 troops and 6.0 tons of cargo were carried into the strike zone.

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20 Mar - HMM-161 participated in a Battalion sized assault on LZ ARGONNE (77-573). Enemy resistance was heavy as three aircraft sustained hits. One aircraft had the controls damaged and was forced to land at (725-525). The crew was picked up and the aircraft was later recovered by a CH-54 Sky-Crane. The other aircraft within the flight that sustained hits continued the mission. The lift was completed with a total of 506 troops moved into the operational area.

HMM-161 also provided a troop lift in support of Operation MAINE CRAIG, moving 131 troops. The squadron was supported by several flights of fixed wing in addition to armed Huey gunships and OV-10's of VMO-6.

21-22 Mar - For two days HMM-161 aircraft launched on assigned missions in support of the Third Marine Division and completed all missions as assigned.

23 Mar - HMM-161 flew a total of 76.1 flight hours during the day's operational commitments. One aircraft was shot down at (ZD 828-628). The pilot, 1stLt C. D. HENDRICKS, was fatally wounded by a .50 caliber round while trying to hoist out an emergency Med-Evac. No other crew members were injured. A Recovery Team was put in around the downed helicopter to secure the area. The aircraft was later flown out by a Recovery Crew led by Major J. S. LOOP.

24-25 Mar - HMM-161 flew helicopter support for the Third Marine Division.

26 Mar - HMM-161 launched 8 aircraft on a tactical troop lift in support of the Third Marine Division on Operation MAINE CRAIG. They flew a total of 43.7 flight hours, flying 131 sorties, carrying 56.7 tons of cargo and 134 passengers for a total of 42 tasks. Med-Evac aircraft conducted an emergency evacuation of 7 emergencies, 3 priorities and 1 permanent.

27 Mar - HMM-161 flew 42 sorties, 23 tasks, carrying 240 troops and 5.6 tons of cargo for a total of 35.2 flight hours in support of Operation MAINE CRAIG. Supporting aircraft of VMO-6, VMO-2 and fixed wing elements provided airborne security. When inserting the troops into the (043-644) grid, the aircraft received fire but sustained no hits. The lift was completed despite enemy fire.

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28 Mar - 140 sorties were made, 110 of which were medical evacuation flights. Two missions, a total of 65 Marines were lost, 12 due to medical evacuation.

29 Mar - 140 sorties were made, 80 in support of the Third Marine Division. One Marine lost his life in a Med-Evac aircraft. The aircraft received intense fire and sustained several hits. The aircraft was flown back to base as soon as the Med-Evac mission was completed.

30 Mar - 140 sorties were again hampered by adverse weather conditions. However, a combat troop assault was attempted into the (95-21) and (97-33) grid squares. Only one Company was able to be inserted before weather forced the mission to be aborted.

31 Mar - 140 sorties were curtailed by low ceilings and poor visibility.
