## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December, the Silver Eagles flew 551 combat sorties in support of operations throughout the I Corps area.

Operations supported were: Scotland II, Kentucky, Taylor Common, Vernon Lake, Fayette Canyon, Nevada Eagle, Dawson River, Lancaster II, Victory Dragon VI, Marshall Mountain, Henderson Hill and the highly successful Meade River. VMFA-115 saw more action on the Barcaps off the coast of North Vietnam and continued to take its share of Commando Hunt and Steel Tiger missions.

It is estimated the Eagles destroyed 250 meters of trench line, 25 bunkers destroyed and 10 damaged; 70 structures were leveled with 20 damaged. VMFA-115 was credited with 4 secondary explosions and 10 fires, 2 KBA's and 2 sampans destroyed.

To acquire this BDA, the Eagles expended 899 tons of ordnance against the enemy. Ordnance dropped by type were:

574	MK-81	250 lb bombs
2653	MK-82	500 lb bombs
256	MK-77	500 lb fire bombs
40	MK-117	750 lb bombs
70	5 inch Zuni rockets	

One of the outstanding missions for the Silver Eagles was Lovebug 500 led by Major SLOWE and Captain MARSHALL with Captain BUTTERFIELD and Major BRITTON in the wing position. The flight, working under a 2200 foot ceiling in mountainous terrain with friendly troops 150 meters from the target and ground fire in the area, destroyed eight structures in a fortified village located in Quang Nam Province.

Captain MAGO and Lieutenant CRIPE, with Captain CANNAVA and Lieutenant BLAHNIK in the number two position, led Lovebug 261 flight later in December and working under more favorable conditions were able to destroy two sampans, kill two enemy V.C., and initiate seven secondary explosions on an enemy held mountain.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. The month of December saw Major K. H. WELSH join the squadron as the new Executive Officer replacing Major R. G. KROPP who returned to the 2nd MAW. The squadron also joined two Naval Flight Officers, 1st Lieutenants D. G. DOBBINS and E. P. JORDAN from VMFA-334 in Da Nang and 1st Lieutenant G. P. HAYES joined VMFA-115 from the 2nd MAW.
2. Casualties. On Saturday morning 21 December 1968, Lance Corporal T. E. NOVAK was killed during an enemy rocket attack.
3. Awards. During the month of December the flight crews of VMFA-115 were recommended for 45 Strike Flight Air Medals. Captains BAKER, BUTTERFIELD, CANNAVA, EVANS, and HUEY received their 1st Strike Flight Air Medals along with Lieutenants COLLINS, COUGHLIN, and CRIPE. Sergeant V. E. BROWN of the Silver Eagles received a Certificate of Commendation. The squadron also saw 3 Meritorious Masts.
4. Promotions. December saw the promotion of six members of VMFA-115. H. F. JASTER is now a Master Sergeant. Lance Corporals ANDREAS, KING and LEAKE were promoted to Corporal. G. J. BROWN and R. E. LLOYD were promoted to Lance Corporal.
5. Bonds. During December, Lieutenant WATSON reported the Saving Bonds had a 86.7% participation rate and members of VMFA-115 participating in either the Savings Bond or Saving Deposit programs was 88.1%.
6. Operations. During the month of December Captain TRUE and Lieutenants MINAHAN and SINGLETON flew their 200th Combat Mission with VMFA-115.
7. Training. During December, Captain CANNAVA and Lieutenant WATSON attended Jungle Escape and Survival course in the Philippines. Captain HUEY attended the Maintenance Management course in Da Nang. Lieutenant Commander WALLESTAD and Captain MAGO attended the RLT Landing Force Staff Planning course in Okinawa. Gunnery Sergeant STRANG and Sergeant GRAHAM attended the KY-28 course in Da Nang, while Gunnery Sergeant THOMAS and Corporal EARL were attending Career Advisory and Corrosion Control courses.
8. Civic Action. The highlight of December for Civic Action was the Christmas party in the village of Chu Lai New Life. Members of VMFA-115 donated candy and other gifts to the children of the village.
