NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 28.6 hours, 2.6 of which were for night medevac. The squadron did not complete all missions assigned due to a lack of aircraft.
- 2 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 32.9 hours, 6.4 of which were for night medevac The squadron supported the ROCMC with Operation Dragon Palace II. One fire incident was reported with resulting damage being minor.
- 3 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 48.0 hours, 5.8 of which was for night medevac. The squadron transported 80 troops/pax and exacuated 60 medevacs. Two aircraft received light damage from enemy fire, there were no injuries.
- 4 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 49.6 hours, 6.0 hours of which are night medevac. The squadron lefted 18.3 tons of cargo and 38 medevacs while also supporting the ROKMC in Dragon Palace II.
- 5 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 35.1 hours total and 5.1 on night medevac. The squadron evacuated 55 casulties from the field and supported the ROKMC in Operation Dragon Palace II.
- 6 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 38.6 hours, 5.7 of which were for night medevac. The squadron evacuated 70 medevacs and supported the ROKMC in Operation Dragon Palace II.

 Two 163 aircraft received hits from small arms fire while a third received several hits when a mortor landed nearby in a medevac zone.
- 7 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 43.4 hours, 6.4 of which were for night medevac. The squadron flew 8 missions today, evacuating 25 msdevacs.

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- 8 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 38.0 hours, 5.8 of which were for night medevac. The squadron evacuated 48 medevacs. One fire incident was reported with minor damage resulting.
- 9 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 43.3 hours, 4.7 on night medevac. The squadron reported no fire incidents this date. Operation Dragon Palace II was also supported by HMM-163.
- 10 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 41.5 hours, 6.0 hours on night medevac. The squadron evacuated 41 casulties and there were no fire incidents reported this date.
- 11 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 39.9 hours total, 2.5 on night medevac and evacuated 36 casulties. Three aircraft received damage from enemy fire. There were no injuries and damage to aircraft was light to minor.
- 12 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 48.8 hours, 5.2 of which were for night medevac.

 SAR from and to Chu Lai went as scheduled. There were no hits reported this date.
- 13 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 33.6 hours, 3.2 of which were for night medevac. The squadron evacuated 22 medevacs and there were no fire incidents reported.
- 14 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 32.2 hours, 6.7 of which were for night medevac.

 There were no fire incidents reported this date. HMM-163 flew in supported the ROKCP in Operation Dragon Place II.
- 15 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 35.8 hours, 3.8 on night medevac. This included 83 sorties and 37 tasks and 31 medevacs. There were no fire incidents this date.
- 16 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 35.0 hours, 6.3 of which were for night medevac.

 The squadron flew in support of the ROKMC and no fire incidents were reported this date.
- 17 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 35.0 hours, 6.3 on night medevac. The squadron reported no fire incidents this date. 27 casulties were evacuated by 163.
- 18 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 47.8 hours, 10.9 on night medevac. One squadron aircraft received automatic weapons fire and sustained moderate damage. The aircraft returned to MMAF, there were no injuries.
- 19 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 41.9 hours, 9.1 on night medevac. This included 146 sorties and 66 tasks, there were no fire incidents reported this date.



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- 20 Aug 68: HM-163 aircraft flew 24.3 hours, 6.5 of which were for night medevac. The squadron evacuated 46 masulties.
- 21 Aug 68: HMM-163 aircraft flew 25.1 hours, 3.2 of which were on night medevac. There were no hits reported this date.
- 22 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 29.4 hours, 6.7 of which were for night medevac. One aircraft received excessive damage from enemy fire and a forced landing resulted, the gunner was wounded and the aircraft was later recovered by a CH-53.
- 23 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 39.4 hours, 16.6 on night medevac. There were 3 fire incidents and 86 casulties evacuated from the field.
- 24 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 53.1 hours, 14.8 on night medevac. The squadron flew in support of Operation Pragon Palace II, and evacuated 93 casulties.
- 25 Aug 68: HMM-163 aircraft flew 29.3 hours, 11.2 of which were for night medevac. The squadron evacuated 46 casulties from the field.
- 26 Aug 68: HMM-163 aircraft flew 34.6 hours, 11.5 on night medevac. One aircraft received damaged from an enemy detonated land mine in a zone. The aircraft was flown to the ROKMC CP and the casulties from the zone were placed on the Huey gunship.
- 27 Aug 68: HMM-163 aircraft flew 38.1 hours, 15.8 on night medevac. There were no fire incidents reported this date.
- 28 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew 38.4 hours, 8.1 of which were for night medevac. This included three fire incidents of medevac missions.
- 29 Aug 68: HMM-163 flew a total of 43.9 hours, 7.3 on night medevac. The squadron afternoon medevac helicopter was shot down and the crew rescued by VMO-2's UH-1E gunship.
- 30 A ug 68: HMM-163 flew 45.8 hours, 15.3 on night medevac. The squadron evacuated 67 casulties and there were no fire incidents this date.
- 31 Aug 68: HMM-163 aircraft in its final flying flew 41.7 hours, 10.8 of which were for night medevac. The colors of HMM-163 are being returned to CONUS for reformation into a new squadron. Highboy medevac no longer flies the sky's of RVN.
