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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 1 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 151 sorties for 33.8 flight hours, lifting 15.7 tons of cargo and carrying 397 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Two medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 civilian routine casualties. Small arms fire was received at coordinates BT 009574 at 1815, AT 987596 at 1630 and BT 014586 at 1900 all of which resulted in 0 hits and 0 injuries. Approximately 50 rounds of .50 cal. were expended in return fire.

On 2 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 308 sorties for 74.0 flight hours, lifting 90.7 tons of cargo and carrying 840 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Four medevac missions were flown evacuating 1 U. S. emergency, 23 U. S. priority, 1 civilian priority and 11 U. S. routine casualties.

On 3 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 145 sorties for 40.4 flight hours, lifting 5.6 tons of cargo and carrying 727 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. One medevac mission was flown evacuating 1 U. S. priority and 1 U. S. routine casualty.

On 4 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 279 sorties for 63.8 flight hours, lifting 13.2 tons of cargo and carrying 1055 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 1 U. S. priority and 10 U. S. routine. Small arms fire was received by 1stLt. J. C. ASTLE at coordinates AT 978593 at 1605 resulting in four hits and two injuries to 1stLt. J. C. ASTLE and LCpl. C. L. PALERMO (minor injuries), also .30 cal. fire was received at coordinates AT 990590 at 1545 and BT 015585 at 1700 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injuries.

On 5 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 349 sorties for 88.7 flight hours, lifting 33.2 tons of cargo and carrying 1675 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. One medevac mission was flown evacuating 1 U. S. emergency and 1 U. S. priority casualty. Two aircraft received 60MM mortar fire at coordinates BT 012595 at 1535 and 1600 resulting in 1 hit each and 0 injury.

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On 6 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 287 sorties for 63.5 flight hours, lifting 5.5 tons of cargo and carrying 1159 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Two medevac missions were flown evacuating 33 U. S. routine casualties.

On 7 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 169 sorties for 36.9 flight hours, lifting 4.1 tons of cargo and carrying 520 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Sixteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 15 U. S., 1 ARVN and 1 ROKMC emergencies, 13 U. S. and 2 civilian priorities and 3 U. S. routine casualties. Small arms fire was taken at coordinates AT 998597 and AT 998594 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injuries.

On 8 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 231 sorties for 61.8 flight hours, lifting 16.8 tons of cargo and carrying 574 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were affected by enemy ground action. Twenty-three medevac missions were flown evacuating 17 U. S. and 1 civilian emergency, 23 U. S. and 3 civilian priority, 19 U. S. and 1 ARVN, 9 civilian and 1 POW routine casualties. Small arms and automatic weapons fire was received at coordinates AT 962572 at 1745, small arms fire was received at AT 953572 at 1810 both of which resulted in 0 hits and 0 injuries. 1800 rounds of .50 cal. fire was returned.

On 9 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 334 sorties for 84.0 flight hours, lifting 18.8 tons of cargo and carrying 814 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were affected by enemy ground action. Twenty-two medevac missions were flown evacuating 18 U. S., 2 ARVN and 2 civilian emergencies, 22 U. S. and 1 civilian priorities and 26 U. S. routine casualties. Small arms fire and automatic weapons fire was received at coordinates BT 043620, AT 958570 and small arms fire at BT 070655 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injuries. The aircraft flown by 1stLt. R. H. JERNIGAN received 60MM mortar fire at coordinates BT 005608 resulting in five hits and one injury, Cpl. K. B. SWANEY (minor injury). Two 40MM rounds were expended in return fire.

On 10 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 217 sorties for 55.6 flight hours, lifting 15.0 tons of cargo and carrying 699 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. One medevac mission was flown evacuating 16 U. S. routine casualties. Small arms and automatic weapons fire was received at coordinates AT 998566 at 0910 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injuries.

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On 11 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 160 sorties for 44.6 flight hours, lifting 0.5 tons of cargo and carrying 329 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground fire. Four medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 U. S. and 1 civilian emergency, 33 U. S. routine casualties. Small arms fire was received at coordinates ZC 205555 at 1645 resulting in 1 hit and 0 injury, also small arms fire was received at AT 815568 and AT 818558 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injury. 1 hit and 0 injury was received from small arms at BT 168576. 550 rounds of .50 cal. were expended in return fire.

On 12 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 102 sorties for 33.7 flight hours, lifting 15.5 tons of cargo and carrying 261 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Sixteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 6 U. S., 2 ARVN, 2 civilian and 1 ROKMC emergencies, 38 U. S., 1 ARVN and 14 civilian priorities, 4 U. S. and 2 civilian routine casualties. Small arms and automatic weapons fire was received at coordinates AT 198546 at 1300 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injuries.

On 13 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 294 sorties for 68.1 flight hours, lifting 27.2 tons of cargo and carrying 968 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. One medevac mission was flown evacuating 4 U. S. and 2 ARVN emergency and 1 U. S. priority casualty.

On 14 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 159 sorties for 37.8 flight hours, lifting 9.4 tons of cargo and carrying 279 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Fourteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 18 U. S., 4 ARVN and 2 civilian emergencies, 3U. S., 3 ARVN and 2 civilian priorities, 7 U. S. and 6 civilian routine casualties. .50 cal. fire was received at coordinates AT 9154 at 2015 and small arms fire at AT 055735 at 2035 both of which resulted in 0 hits and 0 injury.

On 15 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 88 sorties for 23.5 flight hours, lifting 0.1 tons of cargo and carrying 220 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 U. S. and 1 civilian emergency, 1 U. S. priority casualty.

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On 16 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 132 sorties for 36.9 flight hours, lifting 13.0 tons of cargo and carrying 213 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Twenty-two medevac missions were flown evacuating 5 U. S. and 6 ARVN emergency, 11 U. S., 4 ARVN, 2 ROKMC priority and 3 civilian routine casualties. Small arms and automatic weapons fire was received at coordinates BT 069637 at 1320 resulting in 1 hit and 0 injury. 100 rounds of .50 cal. fire was returned.

On 17 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 126 sorties for 32.9 flight hours, lifting 2.0 tons of cargo and carrying 176 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Six medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 U. S. emergency, 6 U. S. priority and 7 U. S. routine casualties.

On 18 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 162 sorties for 42.4 flight hours, lifting 5.9 tons of cargo and carrying 416 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Twenty-eight medevac missions were flown evacuating 12 U. S., 1 civilian and 6 ROKMC emergencies, 7 U. S., 3 ROKMC and 1 other priority, 14 U. S., 3 ARVN, 2 civilian and 3 ROKMC routine casualties. Small arms fire was received at coordinates BT 028566 and BT 011566, also at BT 040609 which resulted in 0 hits and 0 injury.

On 19 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 214 sorties for 45.8 flight hours, lifting 9.3 tons of cargo and carrying 120 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 17 U. S., 1 ARVN, 6 civilian and 2 ROKMC emergency, 5 U. S. and 3 civilian priority, 3 U. S. and 5 civilian routine casualties. Small arms fire was taken at coordinates ZC 203434 at 1215 resulting in 15 hits and 0 injury. Small arms fire was also taken at BT 055635 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injury.

On 20 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 199 sorties for 40.5 flight hours, lifting 0.9 tons of cargo and carrying 160 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Twenty medevac missions were flown evacuating 25 U. S., 10 civilian and 2 NVA emergencies, 12 U. S., 2 ARVN and 7 civilian priorities, 5 U. S. and 1 ARVN routine casualties.

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On 21 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 233 sorties for 46.0 flight hours, lifting 2.0 tons of cargo and carrying 576 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Eight medevac missions were flown evacuating 5 U. S., 6 ARVN, 1 civilian and 1 VC emergency casualties. Small arms fire was received at coordinates ZC 194466 and AT 830520 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injury. .30 cal. fire was received at BT 074621 resulting in 1 hit and 0 injury. LtCol. R. T. TRUNDY's aircraft received 4 hits and 1 injury resulting from heavy small arms fire at coordinates BT 070623, a forced landing was made without further incident and the aircraft was recovered successfully. Heavy small arms fire was also received at BT 075620 which resulted in 6 hits and 0 injury. Mortars were received at BT 059632 and small arms at BT 008631 which resulted in 0 hits and 0 injuries. 700 rounds of .50 cal. were expended in return fire.

On 22 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 157 sorties for 33.7 flight hours, lifting 10.0 tons of cargo and carrying 193 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Thirteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 6 U. S. and 2 ARVN emergencies, 6 U. S., 1 ARVN and 1 civilian priority, 12 U. S., 1 ARVN, 2 civilian and 1 VC routine casualties.

On 23 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 88 sorties for 23.9 flight hours, lifting 0.2 tons of cargo and carrying 203 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Eleven medevac missions were flown evacuating 5 ARVN and 2 civilian emergencies, 1 U. S. and 2 civilian priority, 9 U. S., 1 civilian and 1 ROKMC routine casualties.

On 24 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 118 sorties for 31.0 flight hours, lifting 5.5 tons of cargo and carrying 145 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. One medevac mission was flown evacuating 1 U. S., 5 civilian and 1 ROKMC emergency, 2 U. S., 1 civilian and 1 ROKMC priority, 3 U. S. and 8 ARVN routine casualties. Small arms fire was received at coordinates BT 053644 at 1755 resulting in 1 hit and 0 injury. Further small arms fire was received at BT 053644 and BS 440700 resulting in 0 hits and 0 injury. 150 rounds of .50 cal. fire were expended in return.

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On 25 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 151 sorties for 36.6 flight hours, lifting 6.2 tons of cargo and carrying 249 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Seven medevac missions were flown evacuating 6 U. S. and 2 civilian emergency casualties.

On 26 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 103 sorties for 33.6 flight hours, lifting 2.8 tons of cargo and carrying 125 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Sixteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 1 U. S. and 4 other emergency, 4 U. S., 6 ARVN, 3 civilian and 3 other priority and 3 ARVN routine casualties. Major G. M. LARSON the embarkation coordinator lead the squadron in an embarkation drill in preparation for the forth coming move to the USS Tripoli.

On 27 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 128 sorties for 33.4 flight hours, lifting 2.2 tons of cargo and carrying 328 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. Six medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 U. S., 5 ARVN and 1 ROKMC emergency, 1 U. S. priority and 4 U. S. routine casualties. Orders for the squadron to embark on the USS Tripoli on the 29th of December were received and staging of squadron gear began.

On 28 December 1968, HMM-164 flew 48 sorties for 15.8 flight hours, lifting 0.4 tons of cargo and carrying 167 troops/passengers. Squadron operations were not affected by weather or enemy ground action. The staging of squadron gear was completed today and embarkation commences on 29 December 1968.

STOOPS with the Purple Heart. Also Cpl. R. A. HIAN received the Purple Heart and 30 Air Medals were presented during this reporting period.

6. AIR OPERATIONS. During this reporting period, HMM-164 flew 4776 sorties for a total flight time of 1267.1 hours, 12,588 troops/passengers while lifting 331.7 tons of cargo and evacuating 774 battlefield casualties.

7. SPECIAL OPERATIONS

a. Operation Mead River

HMM-164 flew 809 sorties for a total of 164.6 flight hours, carrying 2985 troops/passengers while lifting 108.3 tons of cargo and evacuating 2 casualties in support of operation Mead River.

b. Operation Victory Dragon VI

HMM-164 flew 8 sorties for a total of 2.3 flight hours, carrying 75 troops/passengers while lifting zero tons of cargo, in support of operation Victory Dragon VI.

c. Operation Henderson Hill

HMM-164 flew 79 sorties for a total of 19.0 flight hours, carrying 197 troops/passengers while lifting 11.4 tons of cargo and evacuating 3 casualties in support of operation Henderson Hill.

d. Operation Taylor Common

HMM-164 flew 205 sorties for a total of 46.2 flight hours, carrying 620 troops/passengers while lifting 10.4 tons of cargo and evacuating 8 casualties in support of operation Taylor Common.

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e. Operation Taskforce Yankee

HMM-164 flew 110 sorties for a total of 26.1 flight hours, carrying 95 troops/passengers while lifting 8.8 tons of cargo and evacuating 27 casualties in support of operation Taskforce Yankee.

8. TRAINING. During this reporting period 20 personnel were qualified as aerial gunners and 2 as crew chiefs. General military subjects training was conducted during this month.

9. LOGISTICS

a. Marine Corps Property during the month finished the pickup for embarking aboard the USS Tropic.

b. Navy Material Section received a new Individual Material Readiness List and started to work up the Activity Asset Report.

c. Embarkation worked on the final touches within each department for the last stage prior to embarking aboard the USS Tropic.

11. AVIONICS

a. Com/Nav. During the month of December 1 through 28 approximately 43 percent of our assigned man hours were expended performing direct labor (500 labor code). The remaining hours were expended in the 700 and 800 labor codes. We had a very low failure rate of ARN-52's, ARC-52's and FM's due to the fine work performed by H&MS-16. During this month we have had men assigned to H&MS-16 performing IMA level maintenance, which will improve their technical knowledge so they can better support the squadron.

b. Electric Shop. During the period 1 - 28 December approximately 40 percent of the electric shop's (W/C 220) man hours were accounted for on MAFS, SAFS and TDCS. SAS, ATS and speedtrim systems accounted for over 50 percent of this time. Also many of the shops man hours were spent preparing for embarkation.

29 December 1968. Major G. M. LARSON, embarkation coordinating officer assisted by Lt. W. F. WRIGHT squadron embarkation officer directed the squadron in an outstanding embarkation from Marble Mountain Air Facility to its new home, USS TRIPOLI (LPH-10). This movement was conducted in less than seven hours. The squadron lead by its skipper, LtCol. R. T. TRUNDY, was proudly able to fly 16 of 17 assigned CH-46A aircraft aboard the USS TRIPOLI. A total of 196 sorties and 15 tasks were flown during this period. HMM-164 moved 319 troops and 56.0 tons of cargo from Marble Mountain Air Facility to Tripoli accumulating 54.8 flight hours for this period.
