NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting period of 1 February to 15 February 1969 HMM-164 supported Special Landing Force Bravo and the embarked Battalion (3/26). During this period Operation Bold Mariner/Russell Beach was completed and 3/26 was also lifted to a new position near An Hoa. Aircraft from HMM-164 augmented First Marine Aircraft Wing during the period 16 February 1969 through 28 February 1969. Flight operations were conducted in support of the 1st MARDIV, 3rd MARDIV, and the 2nd ROK Brigade. The squadron also supported SLF "B" during this period with four aircraft and crews accompanying the SLF to Cubi Pt., P. I. aboard the USS TRIPOLI.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 1 Feb 69 Due to very restrictive weather conditions squadron aircraft were able to conduct only limited missions. Two squadron aircraft were able to assist the vertical replenishment of the USS TRIPOLI from the USS MARS.
- 2 Feb 69 Again low ceilings and visibility severely hampered flight operations.
- 5 Feb 69 The backload of BLT 3/26 commenced with squadron transporting KILO Company to the USS OGDEN and LIMA Company, W/1/13 and a Recon Platoon to the USS TRIPOLI.
- 6 Feb 69 The backload continued with C/1/13 being lifted to the USS MONTICELLO and 15 tons of ammunition lifted from the LSA at White Beach to the USS OGDEN.
- 9 Feb 69 The Operation Bold Mariner/Russell Beach was completed with the backload of the remainder of the troops and equipment from White Beach.
- 10 Feb 69 3/26 was lifted ashore near An Hoa.
- 14 Feb 69 Seven aircraft provided to First Marine Aircraft Wing for augmentation of their assets.
- 16 Feb 69 The squadron off-loaded at Hue/Phu Bai in a total time of less than four hours. Four aircraft and crews remained aboard the USS TRIPOLI in support of the SLF "B" at Cubi Pt.
