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
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PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1 JAN 69. SIX HMM-165 AIRCRAFT SUPPORTED OPERATION TAYLOR QUAMON ON NEW YEARS DAY. LIEUTENANT COLONEL G. L. PATRICK LED A TROOP REINFORCEMENT FLIGHT DURING WHICH 308 TROOPS WERE LIFTED IN 92 SORTIES.
- 2 JAN 69. LIEUTENANT G. L. FORD AND LIEUTENANT T. M. CURTIS FLEW THROUGHOUT THE DA NANG T.A.O.R. U.S. MARINE AND RVN CIVILIAN BATTLEFIELD CASUALTIES WERE LIFTED BY WHITE KNIGHT HELICOPTERS FROM FIELD POSITIONS TO REAR HOSPITAL AREAS. TROOP LIFT AND RESUPPLY OPERATIONS BROUGHT TOTALS FOR THE DAY TO 110 TROOPS AND 13.8 TONS OF CARGO LIFTED IN 48 SORTIES.
- 3 JAN 69. TODAY THE WHITE KNIGHTS FLEW MED-EVAC MISSIONS FOR THE DA NANG OPERATION AREA AS WELL AS FOR THE MOUNTIANOUS AREA OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. A TOTAL OF 27 MARINE, ARVN, RVN CIVILIAN, AND VIET CONG CASUALTIES WERE AIR LIFTED FROM FIELD AND MOUNTIAN TOP POSITIONS TO REAR HOSPITAL AREAS.
- LUAN 69. WEATHER RESTRICTED FLIGHT OPERATIONS OF HMM-165 TODAY, HOWEVER, THE WHITE KNIGHTS FLEW 25 SORTIES IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON DESPITE LOW CEILINGS AND POOR VISIBILITY. ENEMY SMALL ARMS FIRE WAS ENCOUNTERED IN TWO MEDEVAC MISSIONS RESULTING IN 5 HITS. THE MISSIONS WERE COMPLETED, WITH THE MED-EVAC AIRCRAFT RETURNING FIRE IN BOTH OCCASIONS.
- 5 JAN 69. DESPITE POOR WEATHER CONDITIONS HAZARDIOUS TO MOUNTIAN FLYING, HMM-165 CONDUCTED 46 RESUPPLY SORTIES FOR OPERATION TAYLUR COMMON. A TOTAL OF 9 MED-EVAC MISSIONS WERE FLOWN WITH 85 CASUALTIES TRANSPORTED TO REAR AREAS.
- 6 JAN 69. AGAIN THE MONSOON RAINS HELD WHITE KNIGHT FLIGHT TIME TO A LOW OF 12.2 HOURS. 15 SORTIES WERE FLOWN IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON WITH 15 BATTLEFIELD CASUALTIES TRANSPORTED DURING MEDICAL EVACUATION OPERATIONS.
- 7 JAN 69. CAPTAIN S. D. TURNER LED A WHITE KNIGHT FLIGHT OF AIRCRAFT TO THE AN HOA COMBAT BASE IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. CAPTAIN TURNER'S FLIGHT LIFTED 79 TROOPS IN 61 SORTIES DURING 17.8 FLIGHT HOURS.

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- 8 JAN 69. SEVEN INDIVIOUAL MISSIONS WERE COMPLETED BY HMM-165, MISSION DESCRIPTIONS INCLUDED COMEAT RESUPPLY, COMBAT TROOP LIFT, AND COMMAND AND CONTROL.
- 9 JAN 69. MAJOR V. S. REED LED A FLIGHT OF WHITE KNIGHT AIR-CRAFT DURING 122 COMBAI RESUPPLY SORTIES ON OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. HIS DIVISION OF HELICOPTERS LIFTED 26,000 POUNDS OF CARGO AND 263 TROOPS FROM AN HOA COMBAT BASE TO ROUGH TERRAIN ZONES IN THE MOUNTIANS TO THE SOUTHWEST.
- 10 JAN 69. CAPTAIN S. D. TURNER RECEIVED INTENSE AUTOMATIC WEAPONS FIRE WHILE RETRIEVING BATTLEFIELD CASUALTIES FROM FORWARD MARINE POSITIONS SOUTH OF DA NANG. DESPITE THE ENEMY RESISTANCE, CAPTAIN TURNER WAS ABLE TO COMPLETE ALL MED-EVAC MISSIONS ASSIGNED. THROUGHOUT THE REMAINDER OF THE DAY HMM-165 FLEW 157 SORTIES IN 47.8 FLIGHT HOURS WHILE LIFTING 300 TROOPS AND 18,000 POUNDS OF COMBAT CARGO.
- 11 JAN 69. OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON RECEIVED THE BULK OF HAM165'S FLIGHT SUPPORT TODAY. 34,000 POUNDS OF CARGO AND 138
 TROOPS WERE AIR LIFTED IN 131 SORTIES BY WHITE KNIGHT CH-46'S
 IN 37.1 HOURS FLIGHT TIME.
- 12 JAN 69. CAPTAIN L. R. ADAMS EXTRACTED RECONAISSANCE TEAM FOREFATHER WHILE UNDER INTENSE ENEMY FIRE. CAPTAIN ADAMS ELECTED TO RETURN TO THE ENEMY INFESTED ZONE THREE DIFFERENT TIMES TO RESCUE THE TEAM, EVEN THOUGH HIS AIRCRAFT HAD SUSTAINED OVER TWENTY SEPARATE HITS FROM THE WITHERING AUTOMATIC WEAPONS FIRE. THE TEAM WAS SUCCESSFULLY EXTRACTED AND FLOWN TO AN HOAWITH THE ACTION RESULTING IN EIGHT ENEMY KILLED IN THE FIGHT.
- 13 JAN 69. THE WHITE KNIGHTS LIFTED 113 TROOPS AND 6,000 POUNDS OF CARGO TODAY. 15 BATTLEFIELD CASUALTIES WERE TRANSPORTED DURING THE 16.1 HOURS OF FLIGHT TIME.
- 14 JAN 69. CAPTAIN 3. D. TURNER LED A WHITE KNIGHT FLIGHT OF SIX ATRORAFT TO AN HOA FOR CONTINUED SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. 56,000 POUNDS OF COMBAT CARGO AND 437 TROOPS WERE HELO-LIFTED DURING THE 50 HOURS OF FLIGHT TIME. SIX MEDEVAC MISSIONS WERE ALSO FLOWN IN THE OPERATIONAL AREA WITH 49 MARINES TRANSPORTED TO REAR AREAS.

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- 15 JAN 69. THE WHITE KNIGHTS FLEW 60 SORTIES IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. FOUR MED-EVAC MISSIONS WERE FLOWN WITH A TOTAL OF 16 PERSONNEL LIFTED TO REAR AREAS.
- 16 JAN 69. FOUR HMM-165 AIRCRAFT FLEW 97 SORTIES IN THE TAYLOR COMMON AREA. 19 TONS OF CARGO AND 69 TROOPS WERE HELO-LIFTED TO THE MOUNTIAN POSITIONS. LIEUTENANT COLONEL G. L. PATRICK FLEW 29 MED-EVAC SORTIES THROUGHOUT THE DA NANG T.A.O.R. DURING 5.2 FLIGHT HOURS.
- 17 JAN 69. CAPTAIN H. T. FOSS AND FIRST LIEUTENANT W. R. HUNT FLEW EIGHT NIGHT MED-EVAC SORTIES IN THE DA NANG AREA. THE WHITE KNIGHT PILOTS LAUNCHED ON TWO EMERGENCY MISSIONS SOUTH OF DA MANG.
- 18 JAN 69. TODAY HMM-165 FLEW 125 SORTIES DURING 31.6 FLIGHT HOURS IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. 307 TROOPS AND 13 TONS OF CARGO WERE LIFTED TO ZONES SOUTHWEST OF THE AN HOA COMBAT BASE.
- 19 JAN 69. THE WHITE KNIGHTS FLEW 88 SORTIES TODAY, 64 OF WHICH WERE IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. A TOTAL 18 MED-EVACS WERE TRANSPORTED FROM FIELD POSITIONS TO DA NANG AREA HOSPITALS.
- 20 JAN 69. CAPTAIN S. D. TURNER LED WHITE KNIGHT EFFORTS IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON TODAY. THE FLIGHT COMPLETED 100 SORTIES DURING 33.9 HOURS OF FLIGHT TIME DESPITE ENEMY AUTO-MATIC WEAPONS FIRE.
- 21 JAN 69. HMM-165 FLEW 181 SORTIES DURING 53.3 HOURS OF FLIGHT TIME. 25,000 POUNDS OF CARGO AND 257 TROOPS WERE HELD-LIFTED THROUGHOUT THE DAY WITH 15 MED-EVAC MISSIONS COMPLETED.
- 22 JAN 69. CAPTAIN G. A. MC KINNEY AND HIS SECTION FLEW DAY LONG MED-EVAC MISSIONS IN THE DA NANG AREA TODAY. THE WHITE KNIGHT BIRDS FLEW 41 BATTLEFIELD EVACUATION SORTIES IN 13 HOURS OF FLIGHT TIME, WHILE TRANSPORTATING MARINE, ARVN, AND RVN CIVILIAN CASUALTIES.
- 23 JAN 69. CAPTAIN H. T. FOSS LED THREE WHITE KNIGHT AIRCRAFT SOUTH TO AN HOA FOR CONTINUED SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. THE THREE AIRCRAFT FLEW 75 RESUPPLY SORTIES IN 18 FLIGHT HOURS. 302 TROOPS WERE TRANSPORTED TO THE FIRE SUPPORT BASES WITH SIX MED-EVAC MISSIONS ALSO FLOWN.





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24 JAN 69. TEN MISSIONS WERE FRAGGED TO HMM-165 TODAY AND TEN MISSIONS WERE FLOWN AND COMPLETED. MISSION DESCRIPTIONS INCLUDED MED-EVAC, RECONNAISSANCE, INSERT-EXTRACT, RESUPPLY, TROOP
LIFT, COMMAND AND CONTROL, AND ADMINISTRATIVE-LIASON. 254 SORTIES
WERE FLOWN IN 55.3 FLIGHT HOURS.

25 JAN 69. CAPTAIN G. A. MC KINNEY LED FOUR WHITE KNIGHT AIRCRAFT DURING 143 FLIGHT SORTIES. 72,000 POUNDS OF COMBAT CARGO AND 251 TROOPS AERE AIR LIFTED BY HMM-165 IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION TAYLOR COMMON. THROUGHOUT THE OPERATIONAL AREA AUTOMATIC WEAPON AND .50 CALIBER MACHINE GUN FIRE WAS RECEIVED. CAPTAIN A. J. ZALESKI'S AIRCRAFT WAS SHOT DOWN WHILE RESUPPLYING LYNCH LAW HOTEL - A RIDGE LINE ZONE IN THE NORTHWEST OF THE OPERATIONAL AREA.

26 JAN 69. TODAY THE WHITE KNIGHTS FLEW 45 SORTIES DURING 26.2 FLIGHT HOURS. FIFTEEN MED-EVAC MISSIONS WERE FLOWN WITH 42 CASUALTIES FLOWN TO HOSPITALS IN REAR AREAS.

27 JAN 69. WHITE KNIGHT STANDBY BIRDS WERE SCRAMBLED ON THE EVENING OF THE 27TH TO A POSITION IN ENEMY INFESTED ELEPHANT VALLEY. CAPTAIN G. A. MC KINNEY PERFORMED THE SUCCESSFUL EXTRACT OF A RECON TEAM WHICH CAME INTO CONTACT WITH THE ENEMY.

28 JAN 69. HMM-165 AIRCRAFT PARTICIPATED IN A SWEEP AND DESTROY MISSION IN THE VICINITY OF THE INFAMOUS TOODGE CITY AREA. 254 TROOPS WERE TRANSPORTED INTO THE AREA BY WHITE KNIGHT AIRCRAFT DURING A CONSTANT HAIL OF ENEMY FIRE.

29 JAN 69. MAJOR R. G. MITCHELL AND HIS SECTION FLEW 23 MED-EVAC SORTIES THROUGHOUT THE DA NANG T.A.O.R. TODAY. 25 USMC, ARVN, AND ROKMC BATTLEFIELD CASUALTIES WERE AIR LIFTED BY THE WHITE KNIGHTS. LIEUTENANT D.D. HUNDLEY INSERTED ONE RECON TEAM AND EXTRACTED ANOTHER FROM THE TAYLOR COMMON AREA SOUTHWEST OF AN HOA.

30 JAN 69. THE WHITE KNIGHTS FLEW 162 SORTIES DURING 58.2 FLIGHT HOURS, 166 TROOPS AND LY, 000 POUNDS OF CARGO WERE LIFTED DURING RESUPPLY AND REINFORCEMENT MISSIONS. 97 CASUALTIES WERE LIFTED TO HOSPITALS IN THE DA NANG AREA DURING 27 MISSIONS.

31 JAN 69. CAPTAIN L. R. ADAMS WITH HIS SECTION OF 165 AIRCRAFT LED THE FIRST MARINE AIRWING MED-EVAC PACKAGEON THE AFTERNOON OF THE 31ST. USMC, ROKMC, AND CIVILIAN CASUALTIES WERE AIR LIFTED BY WHITE KNIGHT '46'S' FROM FORWARD FIELD POSITIONS. THROUGHOUT THE REMAINDER OF THEDAY, HMM-165 FLEW 18Ø COMBAT SORTIES DURING 48.9 FLIGHT HOURS.
