2. The White Knights continued to support the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit, and the USS Iwo Jima. The planning stage for operation SUBOK was completed, and a rehearsal landing conducted in the Subic Bay Chassifilters. The total number of passengers carried was 4,635 and total cargo lifted was 405 short tons.

3. HNM-165 was available for VIP, SAR standby, on call missions, and other miscellaneous flights. The White Knights carried 1 code 3, 1 code 4, 1 code 5, 4 code 6's and 5 code 7's.

- . 11 March HM-165 off leaded BLT 1/9 and on leaded BLT 1/9. The White Knights flow a total of 95.0 hours, 454 sorties, carried 1,713 passengers, and 258.2 short tons of cargo in support of the leading. Flow 5.0 hours for acceptance checks on 7 aircraft.


