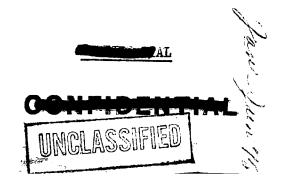

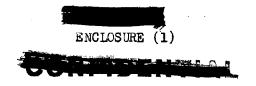

PART II

NAHRATIVE SUMMARY

During the months of January through June, HMM-165 operated accident free, flying a total of 2,704.8 hours of which 37.1 hours were flown by the UH-1E, 26.8 hours flown by the AH-1J, 13.6 hours flown by the CH-53D and 2627.3 hours flown by the CH-46D. These flight hours were flown in support of III MAF (26.2), 3rd Marine Division (834.7), 1st Marine aircraft Wing (22.8), the US S. Navy (25.1) the U. S. Army (1.7), the U. S. Air Force (10.7) and Marine aircraft Group 36 (362.0). Training and functional check flights accounted for the remaining 1421.9 hours. A breakdown of operations shows that during this period HMM-165 flew a total of 1823 flights and carried 16,400 passengers and 441,355 pounds of cargo.

On 27 January, Capt A. J. PONNWITZ led a four plane detachment (two CH-46D's from HMM-165 and two UH-1E's from HML-367) aboard the U. S. S. DUBUQUE (LPD-8) and supported a cold weather exercise in support of BLT 1/9, arriving at Taegu AFB, Taegu, Republic of Korea on 7 February. The exercise was conducted at Pohang and included an AOA located approximately 20 miles south of Pohang airfield. The majority of the operations were in support of the ROK Marines and consisted of FAM Lectures on the CH-46D AND FAM Flights for ROK Marines. The actual field problem took place during the period 19 through 23 February and consisted of recon inserts, troop inserts, resupply, and VIP support flights. During the deployment, HMM-165's CH-46D's flew 49 flights totaling 67.5 hours in which 1,356 passengers and 87,000 pounds of cargo were carried. On 24 February the detachment supported the admin backload of BLT 1/9 aboard the U. S. B. DUBUQUE (LPD-8) and debarked at Futema on 26 February 1975.

On 1 January 75 a two CH-46D aircraft detachment was deployed to NAS Cubi Foint, R. F. in support of the "ZAMBALES" Exercise. During the exercise the detachment operated with VMA-513, and upon completion remained at NAS Cubi roint in support of local Marine and Navy units.

On 29 March 1975, HAM-165 received a Warming Order to embark for the Damang, RVN, evacuation. Hall-165 flew two CH-46D aircraft and two UH-1E aircraft aboard the U. S. S. BLUE RIDGE (LCC-19), two UH-46D aircraft aboard the U. S. S. DURHAM (LKA-114) and eight CH-46D aircraft along with the Squadron colors aboard the U. S. S. DUBUQUE (LFD-8). On 30 March 1975 the squadron sailed for Republic of Vietnam waters. On 4 April 1975 the remaining seven CH-46D aircraft departed Futema aboard the U.S.S. MIDWAY (CVA-41) and transferred to the U. S. S. HANCOUK (CVA-19) on 7 April 1975. All aircraft participated in Fleet/ Task Force Support of the evacuation. During the period 19-30 April 1975, Hell-165 was aboard the U. S. S. DUBUQUE (LFD-8) and proceeded to a holding area off VUNG TAU, HVN, in anticipation of Operation "FREQUENT WIND". OPCON of HMM-165 was held by FROVMAG-39 and on 29 April at 1330, four CH-46D aircraft from HM-165 were launched to commence Operation "FREQUENT WIND". HMM-165's missions consisted of Embassy Evacuation, Sparrow Hawk, and Airborne SAR. At This time, the U. S. S. DUBUQUE (LPD-8) with three remaining aircraft departed for operations off Phu Quoc Island. By 0830 the following morning, 30 April 1975, four CH-46D aircraft from HMM-165 had shut down aboard the U.S.S. DENVER (LPD-9) and U. S. S. DULUTH (IPD-6) having completed their assigned missions and evacuating in excess of 900 people from the U.S. Embassy, Saigon, RVN. HMM-165 crews had



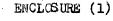


flown in excess of 18.5 hours per aircraft under night, IFR and hostile fire with out relief. Statistics for the month of April revealed aircraft readiness for the month was 99.4% and that airframe utilization was approximately 53.8 hours per aircraft, far exceeding the normal 27.8 hours per aircraft.

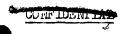
