

A. <u>Narrative Summary</u>

- 4. <u>Logistics.</u> Material has now moved into 3M and two men at Group Supply act as Squadcon Expeditors. During the month of May this squadron has had 220 AOCP's; of these 167 have been filled, ANFE's submitted during the month of May has been 30; of these 16 have been completed. Our AOCP rate has risen from 29 to 53 due to the large increase in flight hours. A total number of 58 excess documents were processed during May.
- 5. Aircraft Maintenance. The Maintenance Department put in one of the most trying and difficult months within memory. In addition to loading more ordnance, servicing more aircraft and intaining less support equipment than ever before, they also completed over 2000 separate unscheduled maintenance actions. Problem areas for the month were engines and AOCP's.
