PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. (U) All operations during the reporting period of Ol through 31 March 1969 were conducted from Chu Lai, Air Base, Republic of Vietnam.
- 2. (U) During the month of March, the squadron continued its efforts in civil affairs. More material was received from "Operation Plane Load", organized by the Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Lion's Club. Twice during the month soap and toothbrushes were distributed to orphans in the Ly Tin district. At present the squadron is in the process of sorting clothes for distribution to orphans in the Ly Tin district.

3. (U) Awards

a. There were 4 DFC's recommended for squadron pilots for heroic combat service; a DFC was awarded to Captain P. B. WYRICK; and a single mission air medal to Major N. L. DERICKSON. L/Cpl MORRISON was awarded a bronze star medal for heroic action resulting from rocket attack on night of 20 Aug 1968. - 4. (U) The combat experience level of the squadron pilots remains high with 81% having flown over 100 combat missions. During the month Major A. OSEGUERA, Captain P. B. WYRICK, First Lieutenant R. D. IAYTON flew their 200th missions.
- 5. (C) During March the squadron flew 838 combat sorties for 947.8 combat hours, while delivering 1,227.65 tons of ordnance on enemy positions and in support of operations listed in PART III, paragraph 2.(c).
