PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. All operations during the reporting period Ol through 31 August 1969 were conducted from Chu Lai Air Base, Republic of South Vietnam.
- 2. There were no awards recommended or awarded during August 1969.
- 3. During the month of August the Squadron flew 633 combat sorties for 760.2 combat hours while delivering 885.13 tons of ordnance on enemy positions and in support of operations listed in Part III, Para. 2.
- 4. The average availability for the morning launch during August was 12 aircraft for 77% of Al aircraft.
- 5. Construction continues on hanger by the 58th Navy Construction Battalion.
- 6. On 2 August 1969, aircraft Buwo 150074 was lost as a direct result of a hydraulic failure obtained from enemy ground fire. Immediate and professional action by both the flight leader and rescue elements resulted in a prompt "pick up" of the pilot who sustained only "Golf" injury.
