PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During August, VMA-211 continued to conduct combat operations from Bien Hoa AB, Republic of Vietnam.
- 2. The month of August began and ended with rocket attacks on Bien Hoa. The first attack, which began at 0525, 1 August, resulted in our first, and to date, only casualty of the present deployment. Cpl Luis ALONZO was killed in the initial volley of rockets as he was assisting in the setting up of the pay line for the off-going night crew. The second attack resulted in no injuries to personnel but three squadron aircraft were damaged by shrapnel. Two aircraft suffered only minor damage while CF-17, Bureau Number 150070, received CHARLIE damage.
- 3. Of 973.4 hours flown in August, 772 sorties for 946.2 hours were flown on CAS/DAS missions in MR III and MR IV, Republic of Vietnam and in the Khymer Republic. This represents the highest monthly total since May 1969, when the squadron was located at Chu Lai, RVN.

- 6. There was one squadron aircraft which sustained battle damage. CF-O1, Bureau Number 151036, was hit by a .51 calibre heavy machinegun round while recovering from a dive bombing run. The wing fuel cell was severely damaged but the pilot diverted safely into Binh Thuy airfield. The aircraft was flown back to Bien Hoa the following day.
- 7. There were no aircraft accidents in August.
- 8. Comparison with July:
 - a. Flight time was UP 14% (64.9 hours)
 - b. Sorties were UP 19% (39 Sorties)
 - c. Ordnance delivered was BOWN 37% (371.7 tons)
 - d. BDA: KBA <u>DOWN 75%</u>
 FFP <u>UP 100%</u>
 Structures <u>DOWN 50%</u>
 Sampans <u>DOWN 50%</u>

The general decrease in BDA for August is only partially attributable to the decrease in ordnance delivered since target availability is such a difficult quantity to measure.
