PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY (C)

- 1. (U) During October, VMA-211 continued to conduct combat operations from Bien Hoa AB, Republic of Vietnam.
- 2. (U) Of 945.8 hours flown in October, 794 sorties for 915.5 hours were flown on CAS/DAS missions in MR III and MR IV, Republic of Vietnam and in the Rhmer's Republic.
- 3. (U) In continuation of a program begun in September, the squadron increased its proficiency in maintenance and use of the CP-741/A Weapons Release Computer. Less than one third of VMA-211's pilots had any previous experience with the CP-741 and virtually none of the systems were in an operational status when the program began. By 10 October all squadron pilots had received lectures and completed the three hops specified by MCO P3500.8, Aviation Training and Readiness Manual for qualification in use of the computer. Simultaneously, two of the squadron's avionics men, through self-study and on-the-job training, managed to have an average of ten aircraft with functioning computers available for the morning launch each day in October.

The benefit of this program goes much further than simply boosting the competence of some avionics technicians or adding another aspect to the professional competence of some pilots. The Weapons Release Computer, when properly maintained and intelligently utilized, offers a weapons delivery method with both high accuracy and large stand-off distances. This is an especially valuable asset against a target heavily defended by large caliber AAA guns. This squadron has not sustained battle damage to any of its aircraft since the initiation of this program, despite an increase in the number of sorties flown in the vicinity of the Quan Loi airfield, an area of known 37MM and 23MM AAA threats as well as numerous .51 caliber machine guns.



- 6. (U) There was no battle damage sustained during October.
- 7. (U) There were no aircraft accidents and five incidents.
- 8. (U) At 0505H, 22 October, Bien Hoa AB received approximately 60 rounds of incoming 122MM rockets. No casualties were sustained by squadron personnel and there was no damage to any aircraft.
- 9. (C) Comparison with September, 1972:
 - a. Flight time was up 10.5 percent (83.2 hours)
 - b. Sorties were up 8.5 percent (86 sorties)
 - c. Ordnance delivered was up 44 percent (372.7 tons)
- d. Eight sorties were cancelled for weather vice seventy-eight in September. Three sorties were cancelled for maintenance vice nine in September.
