PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During December 1968, VMA-223 flew 1205.1 hours and 1160 sorties of which 1174.2 hours and 1129 sorties were flown in support of combat operations in the Republic of Vietnam. The Squadron delivered 1723.03 tons of aviation ordnance with the highest daily total being 93.2 tons delivered on 7 December 1968.

The "Bulldogs" of VMA-223 increased to 8,190.0 the combat hours flown since returning to Vietnam on 22 April 1968. The total hours flown in support of combat operations in the Republic of Vietnam by the Squadron is 27,885.9 during 22,935 sorties. VMA-223 flew 24 more sorties than any other Squadron in Marine Aircraft Group 12 during December 1968.

PART IIISIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. ADMINISTRATION

a. Personnel strength varied throughout the month ending with an increase in personnel. Four Naval Aviators were joined and seven were transferred. One Aviation Ground Officer was joined and none were transferred. Twelve enlisted personnel were joined and seven were transferred.

b. The Civil Affairs Program supported 56 South Vietnamese children during December by providing scholarships. The three schools sponsored by VMA-223 and provided with scholarships, construction materials and other incidentals were Khuong My, Khuong Hiep and Khuong Quan. Plans are being made for the construction of a new school which will accomodate sixty students in grades 1 and 2. During the holiday period, a Christmas party was held at Ly Tin High School for 1,000 students with food, gifts and entertainment.

c. Personnel from VMA-223 received the following awards during December:

- (1) Four (4) Good Conduct Awards
- (2) Two (2) Air Medals (First Award)
- (3) Two (2) Single Mission Air Medals

- (1) Gunnery Sergeant R. L. HENN received a Meritorious Combat promotion to his present rank.
- (2) Corporal E. P. AIRYKE was promoted to his present rank.
- (3) Lance Corporal E. W. SHUPE was promoted to his present rank.

2. OPERATIONS

a. VMA-223 conducted combat air operations on thirty days during December in support of I Corps, II Corps and 7th Air Force targets. Operations and Units supported are listed in Part IV.

b. At the end of December 1968, VMA-223's accident free hours totaled 2669.1. The last operational accident occurred on 21 October 1968.

d. Training

3. MAINTENANCE

a. The Squadron had a daily average of 19.9 aircraft on hand, 15.3 daily availability and averaged 60.5 hours per aircraft for the month for 152.0% utilization.

b. Three aircraft were inducted into Progressive Aircraft Rework and one aircraft was returned from Rework.
